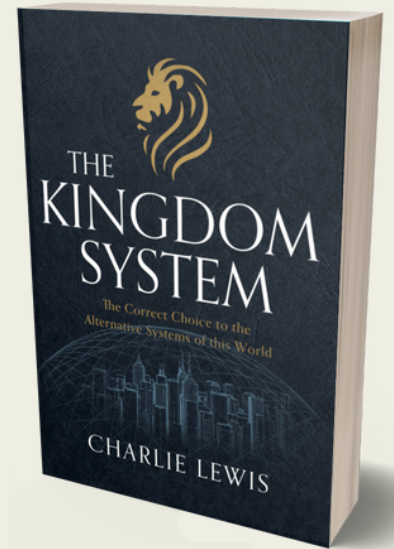

ABOUT THE BOOK



Our God has designed each of us to live joyful, victorious and successful lives. But as we look around at the world today, it seems very few people's lives could be described this way. Even among people of faith, constant struggle and worry seem to be the norm. Why is this the case? What keeps us from experiencing the power and triumph that Jesus said and scriptures declare would mark His followers?

The key lies hidden in plain sight. While He was on earth, Jesus Christ had one central theme and primary message: God's kingdom as His system and order for humanity. More than anything else, Jesus was interested in bringing His kingdom, His reality – His system, His governance, and His way of doing and being right – to the earth, because it has the power to transform everything. The powers of religion have disguised and hidden what Jesus was about, portraying Him as the most religious person to ever exist, and depicting God's Word as a strictly religious book. These caricatures are incorrect and have led people to miss the point entirely.

In *The Kingdom System*, Charlie Lewis explains the reality and power of God's kingdom – what it is, how it operates, and how it will lead you to the life you were created to live. Once you move past the distortions of religion, the most powerful and transformational reality awaits you, and is ready to be engaged through relationship.

WHY IS IT RELEVANT?

- People are desperate to know their purpose and find meaning. It's the human experience, relevant to all of us.
- Millions are frustrated and exhausted with what they have experienced in their lives, angry that the systems put in place by man and government never seem to work for them.
- God has a good plan and design for all of us and did from the beginning before time. A plan for us to experience victory, not just over sin, but in every area of our lives.
- Millions of people have taken the bait and are waiting on a pastor or politician to save them, to make their life better, to tell them what to do. God created a system of being and doing that works to bring about His Kingdom reality on the earth, just as His systems sustain the universe (physics and chemistry and geology, to name a few), plants (botany), animals and human life (biology). We don't have to figure out how to make those things work, they just do by their design. All we have to do is recognize that and operate optimally within those systems. It's no different with God's kingdom. This book (and entire series of books) helps us understand the system of God's kingdom and how to operate optimally within it.
- The secret is not rules — it's relationships. And relationships are a struggle for nearly everyone as our world becomes darker and further divided by the enemy.



"By design, everything God made is structured and works perfectly. Everything. The physics that govern the universe ... the biological systems that govern plant and animal life and even our own bodies. These systems have been built in, so we don't have to create them or manage them. No need to teach our lungs to breathe, hearts to pump blood, eyes to see, or ears to hear. They are designed for life. Taking that into account,

would the God who created the universe and the systems it operates on not also provide us a system of living that works similarly? A way to enjoy His creation and our victory in the Scriptures? Of course He would. The Kingdom System is that way. It is His way of doing and being right. It is all-inclusive and is to be our priority and our first consideration in everything we are and in all we do."

SUGGESTED QUESTIONS

- You mention 'success' in the book's subtitle. What constitutes 'success'?
- You describe the Scriptures as "not religious." What do you mean by that?
- What is the Kingdom 'system'?
- How does God's Kingdom 'system' relate to our own system of government?
- What is the difference between being time-driven and eternity driven?
- What is the difference between income/outcome?

About the book's core message:

1. You write that God created and designed the Kingdom to work for our good. Can you explain how understanding this concept can transform a believer's daily life?
2. In your book, you draw parallels between God's creation of physical systems and the creation of life and the Kingdom. Can you elaborate on how these systems are interconnected and what that reveals about God's design?
3. How does your book address the challenges people face when they feel disconnected from God's Kingdom in their everyday lives?
4. What role does free will play within the systems God created, and how does it impact our ability to live in alignment with His Kingdom?

About its practical application:

1. How can believers practically apply the principles of God's Kingdom in their personal lives, especially when facing difficult circumstances?
2. In what ways can churches and Christian communities better reflect the Kingdom of God as you describe it in your book?
3. For someone new to the faith, how would you suggest they begin to understand and live out the principles of God's Kingdom?
4. How can understanding the Kingdom of God as a system created for our good influence the way we approach work, relationships, and other aspects of life?
5. You discuss the idea that God's Kingdom operates in harmony with His creation. How can we align ourselves more fully with this divine order?

About its theological insights:

1. How does your book explore the relationship between God's sovereignty and human responsibility within His Kingdom?
2. What do you think are some common misconceptions Christians have about the Kingdom of God, and how does your book address them?
3. Can you explain how the concept of the Kingdom of God is woven throughout the Bible, and why it is central to understanding God's purpose for humanity?
4. How does your understanding of the Kingdom of God shape your view on current events and the state of the world today?
5. What scriptures or biblical stories do you find most compelling in illustrating the principles of God's Kingdom as you describe them in your book?



Who we are, Who God is, Who we are to God, and who God is to us is the object of all of our beliefs. Scripture says that knowledge without wisdom profits very little. Knowing without the wisdom of how to personally apply what we learn to our lives experientially creates contradiction and frustration. Our writings are completely about the experiential relationship that is available by the plan and the design of our Creator and our Designer. How do we experience the overcoming relationship of victory that is described in scripture.

- There are absolutes that are established precedents that do not change.
 - There is one unchanging God, Creator of all things, eternally existing in three Persons – God the Father who is God, Jesus the Son who is God, and the Holy Spirit God who is God. Three manifestations of one God who are co-eternal and of equal dignity and power with a special and unique function for each component as the one God. As the eternal “I am”, God exists in the quality or state of being self-derived or self-originated; specifically : the absolute self-sufficiency, independence, and autonomy of God. God lacks nothing that mortals can supply Him.
 - The deity of Jesus Christ, His miraculous conception, His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and His coming personal return to the earth.
 - Man was created by and for God. Man is made in the image and the likeness of God. Man consists of three components with different assignments functioning as one man. We are an eternal spirit, that will never die. Our spirit during our time journey lives in a temporary body that gives physical expression to our eternal spirit. We are managed by our mind – our emotions, our feelings, our intellect, our will, and our imagination which are the result of our allowed programming. Our spirit gives life to our body. When our spirit leaves our body and departs time, our body ceases to live.
 - The first Man Adam disobeying God (original sin) resulted in all men being separated from God and experiencing death. Jesus gave Himself as the sacrifice for our sins, died on the cross and rose again to provide redemption and restoration to (original glory) for all of humanity.
 - Our God is eternal, His Word is eternal, His Kingdom is eternal, and we are eternal. That is our design. These do not change and they are unshakeable.

The scriptures are our governing agreement with the government of Heaven. The scriptures provide the values, the principles, and the established precedents that we agree to use to govern ourselves. The scriptures are our Constitution. We are what they say we are, we have what they say we have, and we can and we will do what they declare we can do. We have full and complete access to all that is provided in scripture.

- Our God, Jehovah is the true and the living God. He is the Creator of all things. He is the Owner and Lord of the Heavenly realm and the Earthly realm. He does not live in temples made by man. He supplies life and breath and all things to every living being. He does not lack a thing we mortals could supply for Him, for He has all things and everything He needs.
- From one man, Adam, He made every man and woman and every race of humanity, and He spread us over all the earth. He set the boundaries of people and nations, determining their appointed times in history. He has done this so that every person would long for Him, feel their way to Him, and find Him – for He is the God who is easy to discover.
- It is through Him that we live and function and have our identity. Our lineage comes from Him.
- We do commerce and we conduct business with the Kingdom government of Heaven’s realm using the currency of our faith. Faith is the currency of Heaven’s realm. There is a canvas in our mind where we paint the picture of our faith for our Creator and our God to fulfill, to complete, and to activate in our lives. We call and bring Heaven to earth to impact and to direct our situations, our circumstances, and our relationships through the verbal declaration of our faith that reflects the picture we paint on that canvas in our mind.
- We never doubt or question what our outcomes are to be. We follow the directions and the instructions from our Constitution. Our priority and first consideration in all things is the government of Heaven delivered to the earth and aligning with His way of doing and being right.



When our God was on the earth in the person of Jesus Christ, He demonstrated clearly how His government operates.

- How did He deal with sickness and disease? He healed all.
- How did He deal with shortage? He multiplied what was there so that after the need was met, there was more left over than they had began with. Loaves and fish, wedding wine, widow's oil.
- How did He deal with lack? He always provided what was needed by engaging Heaven's realm and Heaven's supply. Abraham and the ram, gold for taxes in fish's mouth and an abundant catch for the disciples.
- How did He teach us to deal with earthly circumstances that threatened humanity's well-being? He engaged the greater authority of Heaven's realm and caused the lesser authority of the earthly realm to change. Calmed the storm, walked on water, took authority over all evil and unclean spirits.

Jesus taught us to pray for His Kingdom, His government, His rule, His way of doing and being right, at our verbal directions to come to the earth and to make the earth like it is in heaven. There is no sickness or disease, no lack or shortage, no illegitimate authority threatening our well-being in Heaven. The same is true in the Kingdom government of our God on the Earth.

When God Himself came to the earth in the person of Jesus Christ, He brought and delivered His government and all of its power and all of its authority to the earth for humanity to engage for their well-being and for the ability to live on the earth in the victory that is described in our Constitution.

The Kingdom government of God was made for man and man was made for the Kingdom government of God. Nothing else will fit, and nothing else will work. We expect a different experience and dynamic when Christ returns to the earth, but we will not be sidetracked. There is nothing stronger or more powerful on the earth now, than the redemptive, Kingdom of our God.

Through our redemption, our spirit being reborn, we have full and complete access to all of Heaven's realm.

The Kingdom of God is God's redemptive plan for governance.

The Kingdom of God is humanity's multi-dimensional power connection to Heaven's realm



“The systems of this world teach us to seek *education* for *employment*. Jesus taught in the Kingdom we are to pursue *relationship* for *deployment*. Deployment into our purpose and our design.
