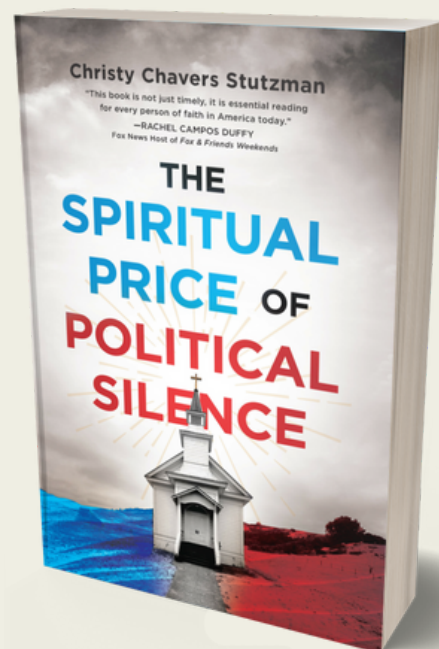
- Are some groups of people in America more vocal, politically active and effective than others? Who and why? What has been the result?
