HOLY COMMUNION — As Christians we believe in the real presence of the Body and Blood of Christ, together with the Bread and Wine, in the Sacrament, given to us for the forgiveness of sins, the strengthening of our faith, and as an expression of the unity of our faith. Those who profess this faith, are baptized, penitent, and acknowledge Christ as their Savior are welcome to participate in the Sacrament.

AS WE GATHER— *"The God who ... gives to all mankind life and breath and everything"* (Acts 17:24–25) wants all people to seek Him that they might *"feel their way toward him and find him"* (Acts 17:27). But in our sinful ignorance, we humans turn instead to idols *"formed by the art and imagination of man"* (Acts 17:29). Therefore, God appointed the Man of Righteousness, Jesus Christ, and *"has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead"* (Acts 17:31). Because He lives, we also live (John 14:19) in His forgiveness, and thus we love Him and keep His commandments (John 14:15). While the risen Lord prepares us for His ascension, He will not leave us *"as orphans"* (John 14:18), but He gives *"another Helper,"* the Holy Spirit, to be with us forever (John 14:16) through the preaching of *"Jesus and the resurrection"* (Acts 17:18). Because He *"suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous"* (1 Peter 3:18), we *"honor Christ the Lord as holy"* and are always *"prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks"* for the reason for our hope (1 Peter 3:15). Our Baptism *"now saves"* us *"as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ"* (1 Peter 3:21).

LITURGY OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION (10:30)

Pastor: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is the means by which the Father creates new sons and daughters. In the waters of Baptism we are joined to the death and resurrection of our Lord. Born again by water and the Spirit, we are made members of the Body of Christ. Living in fellowship with him and his people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

The Rite of Confirmation is the Order in which one's Baptismal Faith is confirmed.

Pastor: Who is here presented to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism and how are they named named?

Baptizand: Parents & Godparents: We present Dorothy Ann and Howard Clayton.

Pastor: Who is here present to be confirmed in their Baptismal faith?

Confirmand: I, Carly Hewett.

Pastor: Who is here present to be received into membership by transfer?

Transferee: I, Clayton Hewett.

The Pastor asks the following questions of the Parents/Godparents who speak for the baptizands:

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all his works, and all his ways?

Candidates: Yes, I renounce him.

Pastor: Speaking and confessing with and all the Faithful here present:
Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

All: Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord?

All: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

All: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection + of the body, and the life everlasting.
