Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It feels like home, too.

Since moving to Teays Valley and Hurricane and becoming a part of Forrest Burdette we have felt like we are home. Coming home feels good! I have met with the mayor, city manager, assistant city manager, and police chief, and they all expressed their appreciation for Forrest Burdette and welcomed me to our new town. I have joined the Putnam County Rotary Club and worked at the City Festival. We have enjoyed going to high school events such as the MSAC Cross Country championship and experienced a Friday night football game with new friends and cheered on the dance team, band, cheerleaders, and football team. Last night Judi and I dressed up and joined many of you for Trunk-or-Treat. We feel like we are home!


