FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Change never stops. Everything is constantly evolving. Change is a part of life. (I am sure that I could come up with a lot more pithy and obvious statements, but you caught the idea after the first sentence.) Last week Judi and I experienced the bookends of life. We went to see Connor and Maria and our one-month-old granddaughter, Phyllis. When we saw her soon after her birth, she slept a lot and nursed and cried. Now that she is a month old, she still slept a lot and nursed and cried. But she was bigger, had a little bit of neck control, had longer wakeful periods. She also started to smile at her grandparents (we believe the smile was not caused by random gas bubbles!). Phyllis is changing, and when we see her in September, she will have changed more.

This past week we also experienced a change that was hard. One of our best friends for the last twenty-four years, David Cramer, died of a heart attack at the age of 63. We went to his visitation on Friday, and I preached at his funeral on Saturday. Even though we celebrated his life, faith, and gift of eternal life, this was not a change we wanted at this time. The timing of David's death was sudden and shocking, but like all who mourn, we feel the comfort and peace of God.

Change, hope, and grief are not limited to the beginning and end of life. Change happens when a friend moves, or we find a new job or adjust to a health challenge. We experience challenges when an adult child moves back home or a younger child struggles in school. Some changes we embrace with enthusiasm and others we accept with a heavy heart.

At Forrest Burdette, we are in a season of change, and it feels like a mixture of grief and hope. Jayné Kirk recently announced her "retirement" after twelve years of ministry, and we celebrated her ministry two Sundays ago. Since General Conference, we have had a number of people leave Forrest Burdette because of the removal of the prohibitions against LGBTQ people having pastoral leadership in the church or churches hosting same sex weddings. Even though our church has not changed its position, some of our members felt they could not remain a part of the church. I have had several conversations with people as they left, and most of them talked about how much they loved Forrest Burdette and will miss it. I know that most of our church chose to stay at Forrest Burdette, but we too feel the loss and grief of having our friends, our siblings in the faith, go somewhere else. This is a change that carries with it sorrow and grief for those who have left and those who have stayed.

I invite you to pray for those who have left and those of us who have remained at Forrest Burdette. If you have a chance, I encourage you to offer a word of support and love to former members and those who continue to be active at Forrest Burdette. We are all a part of God's family, and we grieve together. We may not worship together anymore, but we still love God and our neighbors and are all committed to sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ. Change in our congregation has happened. Some folks, whom we have loved, have chosen to go elsewhere, but many Sundays God is also sending us new people. We have welcomed new members into the membership and family of Forrest Burdette Memorial UMC. Change never stops, but neither does the work of God.

*The mortgage payments are not part of the Operating Budget. Contributions to the Building Fund pay the mortgage each month.

The last two months of contributions to the church have been significantly reduced due to people leaving the church after General Conference. Consequently, we have been working hard to lower expenses. One example is with Jayné Kirk's decision to retire. She will not be replaced on the staff. We have been unable to pay our apportionment to the Conference, which helps our mission agencies, campus ministries, camping, and health care and pension for our clergy. Please understand there are some expenses that cannot be cut - utilities, insurance, and equipment maintenance (elevator, computer system, kitchen facilities, etc.). This is a large building. The electric expense is highest during the summer months and can be as much as \$6,000 just for the church building itself. There are also outside lights, the scout building, garage, and parsonage expenses. We need your support in order to maintain current expenses. Please consider increasing your giving so that we may continue offering ministries for our children, youth, and adults. While you pray for the church, also pray for the Finance Committee and Church Council as we try and determine what our budget needs to be for 2025. May God's will be done both now and in the future in order to assist the growth of Forrest Burdette Memorial United Methodist Church. I love my church family, and I know we can get through this.
