## FROM THE PASTOR

*The following was submitted as Pastor Joe's Charge Conference Report, 12/5/21*

It has been an amazing five months since I started at Forrest Burdette. I have found a warm and friendly congregation that has been welcoming, encouraging, and caring. We have been faithful and forward-looking as we transitioned into fall. We have had Sunday School and worship every week. People have joined us in person and online for worship. The onboarding experience with the staff and lay leadership led by Rene Wilt was quite helpful. I have found that the meetings with the Church Council, SPRC, Finance, Trustees, Mission team, UMW, Sunday School Teachers, Youth Leaders, and COM Board to be marked by prayer and a desire to empower the church to do the work of Christ. Judi and I have hosted two fun events at the parsonage: the college students and then the youth. I have been able to attend a Boy Scouts Court of Honor and meet with their leadership as well as a flag retirement ceremony with the Cub Scouts. I was also blessed to meet with the leaders and two scouts from our Girl Scout Troop. The Neighborhood Gatherings have been a wonderful opportunity to meet people and share our mutual excitement about Forrest Burdette. We hosted the Hurricane High football team for dinner. We also resumed our Wednesday dinner and Bible study. We had a delightful church picnic at the Grants' farm! If you are still reading this report, then you recognize how busy we have been even with COVID challenging us.

Worship has been a joy for us. We love the setting, the people, and gifted people who are a part of the worship experience. Most of the people are behind the scenes, but they are the ones who help make an inspiring worship celebration. Over the past few weeks, we have started our Coming Home series with All Saints, a visit from Bishop Asbury, and a Thanksgiving celebration. On the 21st we had a lot of people stay after church and help decorate the church for Advent and Christmas.

Our children's ministry has continued to offer the love of Christ to our children on Wednesday evening and on Sundays. In addition, we have had a few intentional outreach events: Vacation Bible School, a back-to-school event for the families from Conner St. Elementary, and Trunk or Treat. Jayne' and her crew are active in finding ways to help mold our children in the life and teachings of Christ.

Our youth ministry has remained strong despite the challenges of COVID and remote learning during the past school year. Jeremy and the youth leadership have risen to the challenge and are making plans for Resurrection in the New Year as well as a roller coaster marathon and a mission trip in June.

Forrest Burdette is a very generous and engaged church in missions. In one week, we have emptied the angel tree which means 60 children will receive toys and clothes this Christmas. We have restarted our Backpack Buddies with three local schools. We sponsored Thanksgiving dinner for several local families. We are major supporters of our Community Cupboard. We support Heart and Hand with contributions of time and financial resources. In addition, we dedicated over 300 Shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. We also support our United Methodist Church and the district, conference, and global ministries through our District Promotional fund and our Fair Share of the Conference Apportionment. This allows ministry to take place throughout WV and supports mission and ministry across the world.

Earlier in the Fall I was able to sit down and talk with the Hurricane Mayor, City Manager, Assistant City Manager, the Police Chief and Assistant Chief. I value the strong connection that FBMUMC has with the community! At the city-wide yard sale, we served several hundred hot dogs and met the community in our parking lot. The United Methodist Women recently completed our Fall Festival with hundreds of people from the community participating.

When I arrived, I was impressed with the dedication and giftedness of the staff. Everyone is enthusiastic about Christ and ministry that we do as a community of faith. We meet weekly for staff and are going through the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). We also spend time in prayer as well as plan the activities for the week, month, and seasonal emphases. In addition, we laugh and enjoy being together.

Since March of 2020 we have dealt with the changing landscape caused by COVID. We have added an online broadcast to our worship option. We have gone from online only to a hybrid of in person and online. Many of our ministry teams have relaunched this fall. We wear masks, and the choir and bells have begun to practice again. The practice of financial generosity has been evident throughout this difficult time. We have stayed current on the apportionment and keeping pace with the mortgage. We could not have accomplished the financial goals without the tithes and offerings of the people of FBMUMC. The pandemic has changed the way we live and has altered church life. We have adapted and will seek to continue to be faithful and fruitful in our ministry in Teays Valley.

One of the things I have admired about FBMUMC is our can-do spirit. I have been impressed by the dedication and time so many people spend in keeping our facility in good repair and our ministries fruitful. This does not happen without engagement from many of our congregation and leaders.

As I look ahead to 2022, I see a need to start a Vision Team that will help develop a strategic plan that will chart our course into the 2030s. We also need to build on the strengths of our children's and youth ministries to reach younger people and their families. It is important that we increase our engagement in the community in ways that develop relationships with our neighbors. As disciples of Christ, we need to find opportunities to invite our friends, family members, co-workers, classmates, and neighbors to church. Another discussion that we need to have in 2022 is developing a path of discipleship that leads people to experience the life-changing grace of God, grow as a disciple, and become a disciple that invites others to join the discipleship journey.

I know that this report is long, but it still only provides one small picture of the breadth and depth of the ministry of Forrest Burdette Memorial UMC. I encourage you to prayerfully use this report as a call to be engaged in ministry. Judi and I are excited to be a part of this dynamic community of faith and look forward to sharing the love and care of God with you as we move through Christmas and into the New Year.



### Mission Giving and Outreach

(This figure does not include any of the general giving that our congregation makes through special offerings and designated gifts throughout the year).

### Paid Church Staff

Salaries for the Pastor, Associate Pastor, Administrative Assistant, Director of Children & Family Ministries, Treasurer/Business Manager, Director of Music, Assistant Director of Music, Custodians, Media Technician, and Nursery Workers.

### Church Office Administration

Church office expenses include office equipment maintenance, office supplies, postage for the monthly newsletter and other mailings, offering envelopes, Vanco fees (fees for on-line donations), and all the incidentals included in running an efficient church office.

### Local Church Ministry

Local Church Ministries include evangelism, membership care, Wednesday dinners, adult ministries, Sunday School curriculum, youth ministries, college and career ministries, children's ministries, music ministries, worship, marketing, special events, delegates to Annual conference, and Website design/IT support.

### Local Church Operating & Maintenance

This section of the budget covers church and parsonage utilities, general maintenance for the church and parsonage, insurance, city fire fees as well as maintenance for the piano, fire alarm, heating/air conditioning maintenance, snow removal, and van replacement.

### Capital Expenditures

Church and parsonage capital expenditures beyond normal general maintenance.
