Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Community – what does that mean to you?

Our new mission statement is "Sharing Christ's Love with Our Community." Does community mean your street? Your neighborhood? Hurricane? Culloden? Milton? Scott Depot? Winfield? Or further? The answer is yes. Our community is not limited to the 25526-zip code. Our community stretches from Huntington to Charleston and from the Jackson County line to northern Lincoln County.

FBLaunch Tutoring Center/Coffee Shop:

Forrest Burdette Uth is starting a tutoring/college planning program here at the church. David received a grant of \$9,000 to start a tutoring center where students from the community can get homework help, ACT tutoring, specific subject tutoring, group tutoring, etc. David will also lead college preparation workshops for students gearing up to apply to college like financial aid/FAFSA workshops, scholarship application workshops, general application workshops, and major/career exploration workshops. We will also be hosting College Road Trips to give students the opportunity to travel to WV and local colleges to visit. All these resources will be free, but we will have donation jars for any who wish to donate to the services provided. To make the space inviting, the Uth decided to make this tutoring center into a coffee shop theme. We will be wrapping up the finishing touches on the space throughout August, and we hope to do a hard launch at the end of the month or in early September.


Wednesday Night Bible Study

Hello, everyone! COM is rolling right along. It's hard to believe that we're wrapping up the summer already.

Some updates for the program: Our early ed classrooms are very full for the upcoming school year; we only have a

couple open spots in one classroom and have a very long waiting list to begin calling from to fill those. Please keep the families and children needing care in your prayers because there is just not enough childcare available for everyone who needs it.

Now that we have had the new playground installed and being utilized by the children and community, we just need to have the fence and mulch barrier back in place. Those will both be done by the time you are reading this article. We're ordering some additional mulch to make sure the early ed equipment has the necessary depth since it was disrupted with the new installation, and that will put us at 99 % complete!

The shade canopy, however, is another point altogether. There is an issue with one of the uprights, and the installers were unable to stretch the canopy enough to make it work. Having that issue resolved and installing the canopy are still ongoing projects.

As I said before, there are not enough childcare centers available to serve all the children and families that need them. We consider it a privilege to offer a quality program that has such a long waiting list. We could not provide the service we do for the families in our communities if not for the generosity of the church supplying us with the space, the upkeep of the building, and maybe most importantly, the general prayers and support. We are truly grateful and thankful to be able to do what we do, because of you. Please continue to keep our staff, our center, and our children and families, both new and established, in your prayers as we transition into the fall session. Thanks again for your support.



Purpose

God is calling us to seek God's direction for Forrest Burdette Memorial United Methodist Church in the 2020's and 2030's. COVID and cultural changes have challenged the way we experience life, and they have altered the church's traditional patterns of life. Our challenge is to determine God's plan for our future. The Vision Team and congregation will seek to capture what God is envisioning for us as a church and develop a vision, a strategic plan, and a series of measurable objectives to monitor our progress. Through time, the vision will need to continually be examined, adjusted, and implemented within the church's ongoing ministry.

Beginnings

At Church Council in February of 2022, the creation of the Vision Team and the process that would be used was approved. The first meeting of the Vision Team was March 31st. When the team gathered, we spent time building relationships with each other, studying Scripture, sharing prayer time, and forming prayer partners.

One of the early tasks was creating a covenant to govern the team's life. The covenant for the Vision team is as follows:

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? (Isaiah 43:19)

We Covenant to keep faith with God, our walk with Christ, and the movement of the Holy Spirit.

We **Covenant** to be engaged in prayer: each other, Vision Team, Forrest Burdette.

We **Covenant** to be present and when it is impossible to attend to notify the chair or pastor.

We **Covenant** to come prepared for our meetings.

We **Covenant** to be engaged in discussion and not to dominate or be passive.

We **Covenant** to be honest, vulnerable, and respectful in our speech and participation.

We **Covenant** to use Group Me on a weekly basis to stay connected with each other.

We **Covenant** to relate to our accountability partners and share ideas, updates, and daily prayers.

We **Covenant** to keep confidentiality about personal information and opinions.

We **Covenant** to share with the church in an appropriate and timely manner the progress of the Vision Team.

Prayer Emphasis

As you can see, prayer was a vital part of the team's work. The team prayed in the meetings and at home. The team members also took prayer walks around the church, around the neighborhoods, and around the community. In addition, we read <u>The Open Road</u> by Sue Nilson Kibbey and created the Breakthrough Prayer for our church: *God, grant us the wisdom to know your plan for us and the strength to carry it out. Amen.* This prayer has been distributed in pocket quilts, used in worship, small groups, and classes since the summer of 2022. The team believes that God has been revealing the plan for us.

Research and Study

The team read, watched, and listened to a variety of resources including excerpts from <u>Canoeing the Mountains</u> by Tod Bolsinger, How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You Are Going by Susan Beaumont, and <u>Strategy Matters</u> by Kay Kotan and Ken Willard. The Team also examined the United Methodist data concerning Forrest Burdette's statistics going back several decades. Mission Insite provided a detailed demographic study for our region (Barboursville to St. Albans) that highlighted population, educational, economic, cultural, and religious characteristics.

The team also took an informal survey of people in our community who were not a part of the church about their impressions of Forrest Burdette. It gave the team some interesting observations. We also had a survey with the congregation. The survey was available online, in bulletins, and in the newsletter. The questions were focused on connection to the church and hopes for the future. The team spent a lot of time reviewing the surveys and finding common themes among the answers. (over)

Creation of the Mission Statement

The team spent a significant amount of time brainstorming and discussing a possible mission statement. It needed to be the church's mission which would generate, direct, and empower our ministry and activities throughout the 2020's and into the 2030's. After spending time on the areas of focus it was time to form a mission statement. Pastor Joe believed God was leading us to the statement, "Sharing Christ's Love with the Valley." The team talked about it, prayed about it, and came back to the next meeting to see if there was consensus. The team felt led by God to accept the mission statement with an important adaption. Forrest Burdette's mission statement became "Sharing Christ's Love with Our Community." The team recognized that our community is bigger than the valley, and all need to experience Christ's love. This is not a new mission for the church, but it is a God-given, intentional focus as we move forward. "Sharing Christ's Love with Our Community" becomes our purpose for ministry.

Church Conversations

Through much prayer, conversation, and work, the Vision Team narrowed our areas of focus for the new vision into four distinct but related emphases. On March 19, 2023 the congregation was invited to stay after church and join a conversation around the four areas of focus: Establishing New Connections in the Community, Generating Connections Within the Church, Deepening Individual Connections with Christ, and Connecting Faith to Everyday Life. The church responded with lots of participation, and each conversation group met two or three times. The church's input was taken back to the Vision Team for discussion, prioritization, and the development of possible action items.

2023 Summer Worship

Beginning on June 25th and continuing through August 6th the church has developed worship experiences, explanatory summaries, and after-worship conversations that revolve around the new mission statement, the four areas of focus, and the call for new life for Forrest Burdette.

Moving Forward

At the end of August, the church members will receive the completed Vision document. On September 10th, the church will be asked to affirm the plans that God has given the congregation and then commit to have the strength to carry them out.
