Chris Clark – “Acts and the Early Church” (*Bring your Bible; no additional study book to purchase*)

This study begins early, on Wednesday, August 22. We will explore the early Church as presented in Acts, the Epistles, and Revelation, looking at the difficulties and the triumphs, in order to better understand how they apply to our lives today.

Ellis Conley – Exodus & Leviticus (\$10)

A 13-week study beginning with Moses’ story and ending with the priests and their duties. Some of the major ideas explored are: Moses’ call, Passover, Exodus, covenant laws, instructions carried out, worship, and laws. We’ll look at the texts on three levels: 1. What does the Bible say? 2. What does the passage mean? 3. How does the Scripture relate to my life?

Debby Cunningham – Disciple Fast Track: Into the Word, Into the World (\$16)

This 12-week study is designed to help disciples hear God’s voice through studying scriptures, so they can go into the world as faithful witnesses and be of service to the world. In addition to the Wednesday class, there are daily Bible readings of 3-5 chapters each.

Ron Delph – “Psalms: Managing Our Emotions” (*a photocopied study guide will be provided*)

Emotions are both complicated and complex, both mysterious and mystifying. Even the experts are not sure what causes us to experience emotions. And for Christians, emotions can be troubling, frustrating, and untrustworthy. Some emotions seem deeply spiritual; other emotions seem downright sinful. God created us to experience emotions, yet there are still godly and ungodly ways to manage them. This 12-session course on the Book of Psalms will help sort this out.

Don Gatewood – “I John, II John, & III John” (*Bring your Bible; no additional study book to purchase*)

Linda Hankins – Finding Our Way: Love & Law in the United Methodist Church by Job/Alexander (\$11)

Questions and conflict about homosexual practice and the church abound. We observe The United Methodist Church grappling with issues of importance that divide and confound us. We hunger for our church to engage hard questions and decisions in a spirit of generosity, gracefulness, and mutual respect. Authored by several United Methodist bishops, this book encourages frank and constructive dialogue that will help us conference together and open ourselves to God’s guidance. We seek faithful, fair, just, and loving resolution to issues that challenge our faith community.
