Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Holy Week is an amazing time for us to experience the fullness of what God has done in Jesus Christ. This newsletter details the activities of April and Holy Week in particular. I encourage you to participate in all the events that are scheduled.

It is in Holy Week we get to see who Jesus is, why he became human, and see him accomplish his purpose.

On Palm Sunday, Jesus rides into Jerusalem and the crowd shouts, “Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord” (Lk. 19:38). Pilate asks Jesus, “Are you the king of the Jews?” (Lk. 23:3). On the cross, the authorities put the sign, “this is Jesus, the King of the Jews” (Mt. 27:27). During Holy Week we see the crowd announce him as king, hear Pilate question if he is the king, and notice the sign mocking the dying Jesus. Jesus was a king but not one who was to liberate Israel from Roman rule. Jesus is our king, but we often live as if he is a marginal figure in our lives.

Holy Week helps us realize that God does indeed “love the world [so much] that he gave his only Son” (John 3:16). Jesus became human to embody God’s love. Jesus comes to earth as God’s gift for the world. Jesus’ reason for becoming human is summed up in an early Christian hymn that is quoted by Paul in his letter to the Philippians:

“Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,
who, though he was in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited,
but emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
being born in human likeness.
And being found in human form,
he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death—
even death on a cross” (Phil. 2:5-8).



Holy Week enables us to receive God’s gift of love whose purpose was to embody God’s sacrificial love. We experience that love in the breaking of bread in the Upper Room, the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, the betrayal, denial, and falling away of his disciples (and if we are honest, by us too), arrest, trial, beatings, nailing, and dying on the cross.

Holy Week culminates in Easter when life triumphs over death and Jesus is resurrected. We go to the garden with Mary Magdalene and discover the stone has been rolled away. We don’t understand the mystery of the resurrection, but we can experience the joy of new, abundant, and eternal life. We can lift our voices with the Philippian congregation and sing:

“Therefore God also highly exalted him
and gave him the name

that is above every name,
so that at the name of Jesus
every knee should bend,
in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
and every tongue should confess
that Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father" (Phil. 2:9-11).

This Holy Week, let us lift our voices praising God for the experience of encountering Christ, the gift of love, who has opened the gates of life.

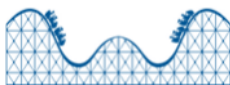
Jeremy Daniels, Associate Pastor Director of Youth & Young Adult Ministries
