Dear Friends,

October is here. It is a time for autumn colors and everything pumpkin spice. It is a season of sports, music, and leaves changing from green to gold, red, orange, and brown. The WV mountains look their best as they put on the vibrant colors of autumn. Even the non-farmers think of harvest and the bounty of God's blessing.

This season is also a time for us to continue to celebrate and experience God's blessing through the beatitudes at the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5. When we look at the Beatitudes, we notice that some of the blessings describe our circumstances while others relate to our spiritual condition, and finally still others to our outlook on life. I think it is important that we know those blessings are available to us now because it is Jesus who spoke these blessings and it is in his name and authority, they are effective immediately.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes in **Cost of Discipleship** that the disciples "*are all members of the Church which is called of God... and that all are called to be what in the reality of God they are already. The disciples are called blessed because they have obeyed the call of Jesus, and the people as a whole because they are heirs of the promise*" (p. 119). The Beatitudes are a blessing because of Christ, and we are made recipients of the promised blessing through his grace.

By memorizing, praying, and reflecting on the Beatitudes we can experience the blessings of Christ in the midst of the challenges and experiences of life. I invite you to make the Beatitudes a part of your devotional life throughout October. In addition, I hope you join us in worship as we celebrate the Beatitudes. If you are ill or out of town, please participate through Facebook or YouTube. I look forward to praying and worshipping together. This Sunday, October 2nd we will focus on the Beatitude of mercy. Please reflect on the mercy you have received and the mercy that you have given.

reboot

David Westfall, our Minister of Youth & Young Adults, recently spent two days at Spring Heights where he participated in an introductory session for the Reboot program, a one-year collaboration with the WV Conference and the SMU Perkins School of Theology. A limited number of churches from across our Conference will work together in this program to learn how to implement an innovative, specialized, congregation-wide approach to youth ministry. Read on to learn more about how this process works.

“Reboot is a program of SMU Perkins School of Theology. We help people discover a new approach to youth ministry—one that involves the whole church and that integrates work with youth into the life of the congregation. If your church is ready to be innovative, we can help you customize a plan that maximizes the particular gifts and mission of your people.

“We have a lot to offer your church—including mentors to work alongside you, classes and retreats to train your leaders, plus other excellent resources to get you started. (We can provide so much because we’ve received generous support from the Lilly Endowment.)

“You, in turn, will help other congregations that come along after you by sharing with them what you have discovered. Here’s a look at the process.

Phase 1

This is the time for big dreams and wild ideas.

Here’s the first action step your church can take: assemble a Reboot Leadership Team. It needs to be a team, not a solo Pied Piper. And the team needs to be integral to church leadership, not a siloed youth ministry committee. Here’s the good news: the people on your team don’t need any prior youth ministry experience.

They just need to represent the whole church — young people, clergy, parents, and other adults.

The goal of this phase is to get your congregation thinking, discussing, and praying about youth ministry. Where have you been? Where do you want to be headed? This phase takes about 6 to 8 months, during which the Leadership Team should meet at least 6 times.”

There are two more phases; this is where we are in the process at Forrest Burdette. On **Sunday, October 16**, directly after morning worship, David will be hosting a **Town Hall meeting** to discuss the depths of the Reboot Youth Initiative. There will be light snacks provided. This will be a time to discuss youth ministry in the context of the whole church. There will be time for people to contribute to the conversation with their own ideas and thoughts. **Everyone in the congregation is encouraged to attend. You are a part of our youth ministry.**

While our team was devastated to not be able to go at this time, we are truly grateful to our Haitian partners for keeping watch on the situation and making us aware of the serious turn of events there. On a positive note--most of the medications that we were taking with us were sent ahead of our team and made it safely to the clinic in Fort Liberte' where the Haitian medical team will be able to distribute as needed to the people. Additionally, there is a food distribution plan in the works with the project fund money that was collected, and hundreds of families will benefit from that effort. I cannot thank you enough for your prayers, words of encouragement, and donations of medications, supplies & finances. Please know that it is all being used for the Haitian people in one way or another. I am so thankful and blessed to be part of such a generous and supportive congregation who is so willing to be an impact in the lives of our less fortunate brothers and sisters around the world.
