Message from Mother Pat The week after

This is the *week after* the Resurrection, the *week after* the filming, the *week after* my last day at St. James, the *week after*. . . .

St. Augustine once described the difference between our experience of time and God's experience as the feeling of being stretched among past, present, and future. For us, time is like singing a song and being caught among recalling what we just sang, singing the words in the moment, and anticipating the words to come.

It's difficult to navigate time while being held in God's eternal timelessness. On the one hand, we try to hold onto what was and we attempt to re-create the moment for ourselves, for others, or for our church or the nation. But on the other, we give up because we are confronted by complex issues, or we find that to re-create something from our memories just does not work. Change is inevitable.

Perhaps instead of trying to re-capture a moment, we might think about life, as one writer says,

. . . as a great river of being within God's life. While what was, what is, and what will be might feel segmented; in truth they are tethered and braided together, flowing like drops moving and twisting in a river. In a way, I don't need to know the specifics. I need to embrace the movement. I simply need to listen, to feel, to swim, to let the current move me and discover the subtle ways I can conform my life to move with it

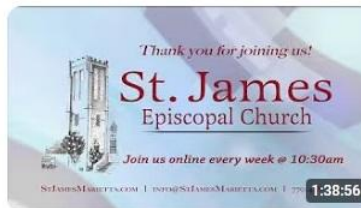

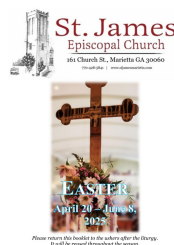

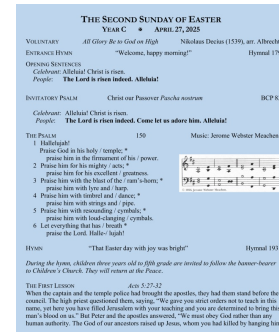

Pulse of the Parish

The Parish Hall crowded with actors and extras getting makeup and costumes, the parking lots full of trucks and cranes, and crew carrying and wheeling things up and down the halls some days from 5:30a to 11p: For parishes less accustomed to the film industry, all this activity might be very exciting. For the people of St. James, it's just another movie week.

But it was the movie people who were excited when a bird flew in the double doors by the parish hall. He took a tour of the halls before resting in the parlor, which had been set up for a scene. This was a major emergency. The little guy bumped his head and left a little smudge of blood on the ceiling tile. He was dizzy awhile, but recovered and flew off to the nave. Someone played bird calls on their phone to entice him out the double red doors. Work suspended until he left of his own volition.

Do you remember when a bird came into the nave on Pentecost? We wondered if it was a sign from the Holy Spirit. But there's also precedent in Psalms 84:3-7, "The sparrow has found a home where she can raise her young, even by your altar, O Lord."



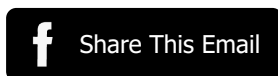
