

Message from the Rector Come to the Parish Meeting

Since arriving in May, I have been consistently impressed with the spirit of faithfulness, generosity, and service shown in this community of St. James. This parish is blessed with an abundance of people, ministries, and resources for making Christ known in Marietta. My family and I have appreciated the warm welcome we have received. I am making good progress on my goal of having one on one conversations with as many of you as possible in this first year, but still have many folks to meet with- so please make use of the Calendly to schedule a time to let me know a little about you and your St. James story.

When I first arrived, I reviewed the results of the Congregational Assessment Tool completed during your interim period. It indicated that your three priorities as a congregation were 1) to make necessary changes to attract families with children to our church, 2) to develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of the church, and 3) to create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships (for example, small groups, nurtured friendships, shared meals, etc.).

I have used these three priorities as a framework for these first six months of ministry as your rector.



St. James & Jamaica, a family connection

Member Angela Bent sent this note:

I spoke with Michelle Morris during the coffee hour after the service, this past Sunday and am now aware that some discussions have already begun with regards to hurricane Melissa which has heavily impacted the people of Jamaica, the hardest hit being the parish of St Elizabeth.

My husband is from this parish. Our loved ones live and farm there supplying produce to the hotels in Kingston, Montego Bay and to groceries stores. A strong people with a fragile infrastructure in some parts have experienced the worse hurricane the island has ever encountered.

Where we are in contact with Episcopal church leaders of Jamaica, especially in and around the parish of St Elizabeth, I would like to offer my support to help with the organization of any effort we might pursue to help our fellow human beings in the aftermath of this natural disaster.

The collect for Sunday points up a theme of how God is revealed in Scripture. The sequence hymn #632 is addressed to "the Word Incarnate" whose glory radiates "from scripture's page... a lantern to our footsteps" from "age to age."

During communion, there will be a hymn that describes every movement we make at the altar: "Now the silence, now the peace, now the empty

hands uplifted..." leading to our rising to our feet and going out into the world, "heart forgiven leaping" (#333).

For the first time in recent memory -- around 25 years -- children will join the adult choir for the anthem. They will lead the congregation in the refrain for The First Song of Isaiah. Jack Noble White's setting of Isaiah 12 was composed in 1975 for a hundred voice youth choir gathered from across the country in Mobile, Alabama. White found himself inspired by "water gently lapping against the pier" one evening and wrote the simple song that has now remained in print for decades. The congregation is urged to join in!

The opening voluntary, "Blest Be The Tie That Binds," was chosen for the day St. James meets as a parish to celebrate what God has done and give thanks for the beloved community that serves the world as Christ's hands and feet.

The closing voluntary is a lively capriccio by Froberger (1616-67), a predecessor of J.S. Bach whose dramatic style of writing contrasts contrapuntal sections with fantasia-like responses.

Pulse of the Parish

Choral scholar **Nathaniel Davila** presented a recital Sunday night. In Scott Hall of KSU's Bailey Arts Center, we heard live performances of several chamber works by Nathaniel. The theme of the recital was a question, "How do you express character in music?" In a three-movement work for piano, cello, and bassoon, Nathaniel played with the notion that time changes character while character also changes our perception of time.

We also viewed a short film *Distance* for which Nathaniel composed the score. The story is about a relationship when the partners are separated for a summer. The director used split screens to show the action, so Nathaniel created parallel themes. Like parallel lanes of a north-south highway, the characters' themes moved in opposite directions: not a good sign for their relationship!

Another piece featured a choir singing vocalese in close harmony over, and sometimes against, a tonal background created by instruments.



choir.


