

Message from the Rector Prayer for Thanksgiving

Dear Ones

Thanksgiving is one of only two secular holidays that get their own collects in the Book of Common Prayer- the other is Labor Day.

You can find the Thanksgiving Day collect on p. 194 (Rite I) and p. 246 (Rite II) of the BCP, and it's a great blessing to use before your Thanksgiving meal.

Personally, I prefer the Rite I language as it has a little extra majesty with its formality and arcane usage:

Thanksgiving Day
Almighty and gracious Father, we give thee
thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season
and for the labors of those who harvest them.
Make us, we beseech thee, faithful stewards of thy
great bounty, for the provision of our necessities
and the relief of all who are in need, to the glory of
thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who
liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. Amen.

You can hear this collect live at Evening Prayer at 6:30PM on Wednesday, Nov 24th on Thanksgiving Eve. All other usual Wednesday programming is taking the night off for the holiday this week, and the parish office will be closed on Thursday and Friday.

As you celebrate Thanksgiving this week I encourage you to take some time to name all the things that you are grateful for- better yet, in the case of those who you are thankful for, tell them!





This Sunday's music embodies the anticipation and warmth of the Advent season.

Bach's organ prelude on *Wachet auf* ("Sleepers, Wake!") is among his best-known works. It offers a characteristically elegant synthesis of counterpoint against the hymn tune which beings the worship service. This three-part texture "sandwiches" the melody between the constantly moving pedal notes and a counter melody in the

right hand which illuminates Bach's genius as a composer. It also features the organ's unique capacity to simultaneously voice three separate musical ideas—a triumph of instrumental evolution and a delight to the listener. (And a bit of a challenge for the organist, too.)

The offertory anthem, John Ness Beck's "Every Valley," with its confident, melodic promise, is a modern choral gem that feels both familiar and fresh.

The hymn "O Heavenly Word, Eternal Light" sung during the Eucharist provides a moment of calm simplicity. The tune can also be heard in Brahms's motet *O Heiland, reiß die Himmel auf* which develops the atmosphere with rich, yearning harmonies. Link here to a recording on YouTube.

The Welsh composer William Mathias's bright, rhythmic service music will carry us through Advent. St. James has used his setting of the *Sanctus* often, but the *Kyrie* and *Agnus Dei* have not been sung recently. Did you know that the husband of a St. James choir member studied music with him? The mystery person will be revealed in this column next week.
