Treasurer (or Secretary): Our Secretary is willing to move into the Treasurer role, but cannot be two people at once! The role of secretary includes taking all meetings notes and dispersing minutes to Friends members following meetings, and maintaining records. The Treasurer is responsible for the financial records, collection, safekeeping, and disbursement of funds. They also keep other members informed of the group's financial standing, and prepares annual reports.
