We sing with the teacher and listen to stories.











We play house and dress-up. We play with blocks and puzzles.

Sometimes I get sad because I miss my family. It's ok, I will see them soon.






My family is busy at work, school, or home. I can have fun playing at my school.

Sometimes I get sad because I miss my family. It's ok, I will see them soon.






My teacher helps me feel better. She tells me that someone will be here soon to pick me up. I can have fun playing at school.
