"The world is all messed up. The nation is sick. Trouble is in the land; confusion all around... But I know, somehow, that only when it is dark enough can you see the stars. And I see God working..." (The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, April 3, 1968)

Where did you see God made manifest in 2020?

When we cheerfully handed out Star Gifts in January 2020, I had no idea how important this question would be. "Look at the gift written on your colorful star," I instructed, "and watch to see how God is made manifest through that gift in the coming year."

Who knew how dearly we would long to see God's shining presence with us in that darkest year in recent history? When I have asked people this year what gift they had, they always remember, and often tell me with a chuckle, as if to say, "And boy, did I need it this year!" God does always give us just what we need when we need it, right?

I am looking forward to celebrating with you on Epiphany (which we will celebrate Jan 3), as we hear from some people about the ways God has made an appearance to shine light into the darkness of 2020. In a year in which the term "doom-scrolling" became well-known, and we practically expected each day to hear more bad news, and every bad thing that happened was punctuated with an exasperated, "Ack, 2020!" – this practice of actively seeking God can be a lifeline for us. Because friends: I believe God

is with us in the darkness. In fact, I think God is with us *even more profoundly* in the darkness. After all, as Martin Luther King, Jr. observed in 1968, another notoriously difficult year, "only when it is dark enough can you see the stars."

I need to see those stars, my friends. I need to see those glimmers of light. I admit that it has been hard work this past year, striving to bring you some good news each week, to keep all of our hearts aimed toward the source of all light and life. And that is why I'm looking forward to hearing the good news from you: I need to see how God has shined in your life, how God has been made manifest in your dismal days, how God has sparkled even more brightly in the dark expanse of the nighttime sky.

I hope you will share those reflections by sending in a video to share during worship (instructions later in this newsletter). Or if you're not comfortable with making a video, I hope you will write something that I can read during worship. Or if you're not comfortable even with that, I hope you will share confidentially, just with me.

Where did your star gift twinkle away the darkness, even if just for a small moment? *Where was God made manifest in your life in 2020?*

Church Council met on December 15, 2020

Annual Meeting: Council is focused on preparing for the Annual Meeting, which will take place Sunday, January 31 following worship. We are doing our best to anticipate both income and expenditures in another highly unpredictable year. We want to be effective stewards of the St. Paul's resources, and this year that involves more guesswork than usual.

Benevolence Giving: The Congregation of St. Paul's has been extremely generous in their giving to the Benevolence fund this year. Council voted to distribute the \$3700 in that dedicated account to the Upstate Synod (to support other ELCA congregations in the region); LOOP Ministries; and RAIHN/Family Promise. This is financial support above and beyond what the church budgeted for 2020.

Council Membership: Kiki Coffey and Anne Olivia Cincotta will step down from council at the end of the current term. We are so grateful for their gifts of time and service to the church!

Council will meet again by Zoom on Tuesday, January 19 at 7:30pm.



## **RAIHN Updates**

RAIHN (the Rochester Area Interfaith Hospitality Network) has been extremely busy in 2020 due to the challenges that the pandemic has caused, but it has also been making plans for its future.

- Beginning in May, RAIHN transitioned the Shelter Program from a rotational congregation-based model to utilization of **hotel space for shelter**, **providing housing for 14 families** since reimagining and reopening the shelter program at the Comfort Inn in Greece.
- RAIHN continues to provide unlimited **food and supply boxes**, **mental health counseling** or referrals, and assistance in **navigating online**, **remote learning** for the 23 families in the Aftercare & Stabilization Program.
- What keeps them most busy is calls from **families who request assistance with rental arrears or a security deposit** through the Prevention, Diversion, & Rehousing Program. Of the 790 calls for support since January (all of whom were spoken with directly), RAIHN has been able to **assist 85 families**, including 179 children, thus far in 2020, with funding to prevent an eviction or regain housing. These calls have increased in recent weeks, averaging about 50 calls a day.

Looking forward, RAIHN has just hired a Manager of Development & Community Engagement, who will help with the exploration of new models of shelter to meet the needs of the community, as well as a name transition. RAIHN will be transitioning its name to **Family Promise of Greater**

**Rochester** over the next six months. While their name will change, their mission remains the same: to provide services to the most vulnerable families in the community, while recognizing the promise each family has to realize their potential. RAIHN is a 16-year affiliate of Family Promise, and this name change formalizes their relationship while further enhancing their services to truly reflect the five points of the Family Promise star: **shelter, stabilization, prevention, community, and promise.**

*St. Paul's continues to act as a Support Congregation of Family Promise of Rochester (it's not too early to start practicing the new name!), providing volunteers and meals 4 to 5 times a year to support the Shelter Program in partnership with First Presbyterian Church of Pittsford and Christ Episcopal Church Pittsford. Watch for upcoming opportunities to get involved in 2021!*
