Spotlight: Language Arts

In a few days, your student will be taking the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS) in all **four** academic areas: Language Arts, Algebra, Science, and Social Studies. This state assessment measures how well eighth-grade students have learned the knowledge and skills in each area, and provides information about student achievement and readiness to move onto the next level of learning.

In eighth grade, this is especially important— passing GMAS in Language Arts and Math is **required** in order to be promoted to ninth grade. In Language Arts, this means that students must read and comprehend high-level texts, and write well-developed responses in a relatively short amount of time. The chart to the right shows some of the skills that students must demonstrate:

Teachers are working with students on a daily basis, unpacking assessment data and providing targeted support for students who have not yet mastered the required content. eCLASS pages are updated with tons of resources, including practice assessments and writing prompts -- all as part of regular instruction! WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP YOUR CHILD EXCEL?

- **Mark your calendars!** Attendance is crucial during the weeks leading up to and including the GMAS exams.
- **Know the numbers!** If your student has failed to meet grade-level expectations in past years, help them prepare at home. Challenge your proficient student to move to distinguished!
- **Ask questions!** Ask your student how they are preparing and how you can help. Remind them of resources!
- **Believe!** The GMAS is one indicator of student learning in GCPS – and it is powerful. Talk to your child’s teacher if you have questions.

In eighth grade, students must score at least 525+ for Proficient OR 581+ for Distinguished on the Language Arts GMAS. Students are also expected to demonstrate a Lexile score of 1185L or higher. In addition to meeting scoring requirements, ALL students are expected to show growth from the previous year's testing.
