COURSE OVERVIEW:

4-hour SPOT course:

- The participant will learn threat and vulnerability analyses and how these can be used to establish effective defenses. Participants are also provided with an overview of security operations that can be applied for prevention and detection of potential terrorist acts.

- The information learned can be incorporated into planning for chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear and explosive (CBRNE) component and device interdiction, conducting behavioral assessments, implementing screening operations, conducting non-intrusive inspections, scene control, evacuation, and media relations.

4-hour Train the Trainer:

- Establish trainers in EMS agencies/Training and Educational Institutions across the state to providing SPOT training for EMS and other emergency responders in their service regions.

CONTINUING EDUCATION:

Attendees will be eligible to receive KBEMS 16-10-02 8.0 hours of continuing education.

- Instructional Techniques 4.0 hours of MOI
- Elective/Disaster 4.0 hours
