The KY Board of EMS is a staff of 17 and is operating at maximum capacity. On Monday, March 16th, we implemented our agency continuity of operations plan:

- 1. All certification/license processing is occurring without delay.
 - a. Certification/licensure provider cards will be mailed April 18, 2020. A PDF copy of the certification/licensure card can be downloaded by the EMS provider from the documents section in their KEMSIS account.
- 2. Some staff are in the office while others are working remotely.
 - a. Please be understanding if there are delays in returning your calls, emails, and answering support tickets. All communications will be answered.
- 3. We are now staffing the CEOC from 8:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m., twelve (12) hours each day.
- 4. All KY Board of EMS resources are being primarily directed to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 5. All on-site EMS inspections will be suspended until the conclusion of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 6. EMS-TEI renewal has been extended from March 31, 2020 to June 30, 2020.
- 7. KBEMS BLS Psychomotor Representative (State EMS Official) application process will be extended through August 31, 2020.
- 8. Emergency regulations are being developed concerning education, certification/licensure, and operations.
 - a. The intent of the emergency regulations is to alleviate the regulatory conflicts identified in the existing regulations in relation to mitigating the COVID-19 pandemic in Kentucky.
 - b. Submission of the proposed emergency regulations will be given the highest priority.
 - c. The proposed effective date will be present date through the current certification/licensure cycle which ends on December 31, 2020.
 - d. Review of existing EMS regulations will be ongoing and appropriate regulatory action will be taken throughout this event to allow EMS providers to perform their job unimpeded by regulation barriers.

- 9. KY Board of EMS communication strategies for the COVID-19 pandemic include:
 - a. The addition of a COVID-19 Q&A picklist in our support ticket system.
 - b. A special site dedicated to COVID-19 has been created on the KBEMS website at (KYEMS.com). This site contains the latest COVID-19 information relevant to the EMS community and additional resource links which include KDPH, NHTSA, NIOSH, and the CDC.
 - c. Providing regular communication updates on COVID-19 for the EMS community, which include:
 - i. Communication specific to the EMS provider audience impacted by the information released. (EMS services, Training Centers, and Providers)

- 1. <u>KEMSIS</u> (Kentucky Emergency Medical Services Information System) email correspondences.
- 2. KYEMS "Heads Up" application on smartphones. (Heads Up KY EMS)

 - 1. EMS PPE, best practices, and infographics.
 - 2. EMS assessment and PPE flow chart to include CDC PPE donning and doffing.
 - 3. Contact local emergency management with PPE requests.

1. LTC facility screening and importance of compliance with screening by EMS providers responding to calls.

- 1. Educational guidance forthcoming through "Education Matters" Newsletter.
 - a. Clinical/Field internship cancelations

 - c. Alternative educational strategies
- KBEMS COVID-19 education issues survey sent to all EMS-TEI administrators on March 24, 2020 using "Survey Monkey".

10. EMS agencies are requested to:

- a. Be concise in documentation of ALL patients to ensure appropriate disease surveillance can be conducted.
- b. Thoroughly document PPE use on EVERY call (exposure tracking).
- c. Use PPE when indicated.
