## A note from Mrs. Organ:

As we begin the month of September, and the first full week of school is under our belts, I certainly hope that your children are developing a routine that is working for you and your family. I realize it can be difficult to transition from a relaxing summer schedule to one that is very demanding on students and parents alike. It may seem that students are coming home tired and may become a bit overwhelmed as they try to schedule homework into busy routines along with their extracurricular activities.

The beginning of a new school year is a great time to try and help your student to establish some routines that will help him/her to be successful as we begin the year. Please encourage your child to find a quiet place to complete homework and set aside time in the evening schedule to complete it. Reviewing homework folders and teacher notes with younger students each day and checking planners and Google classroom with the older students is the best way to keep up with teacher expectations and assignments. If you have questions about homework or assisting your student with their academics, please contact the teacher for clarification. A general guideline for students and homework expectations is:

Grades K-3 (20-40 minutes)

Grades 4-5 (45 minutes-1 hour)

Grades 6-8 (2 hours max.)

If you see that it is taking your child an inordinate amount of time to complete their homework, please contact the teacher for assistance.

I am hopeful that you were able to attend our Back to School Nights this week and learn more about your child's schedule and meet with the teachers. I cannot stress enough the importance of developing a good relationship with teachers to communicate any concerns that may arise early on and show your student that we are working together to help in his/her success.

I also hope that you and your family have been able to get involved in many of our Back to School events that have taken place over the last several weeks. I would like to thank our PTO, our Welcome Committee and the Carnival Committee for all of their assistance with the Kindergarten Picnic, Back to School Night, and the Back to School Carnival. I know a great deal of work and planning goes in to making these things happen, and your time and assistance is so appreciated.

If you are looking for more ways to get involved at OLP, we are always looking for volunteers. In particular, we could use assistance with our Parents on Patrol program, morning crossing guards and lunchroom assistance. Please contact the school office if you have any questions about these opportunities. If you are able to attend the PTO meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 3, they can also provide you with more information about opportunities to get involved.

Without the help of our wonderful families, all that we do would not be possible. Thank you for all your support and your eagerness to help serve our students!

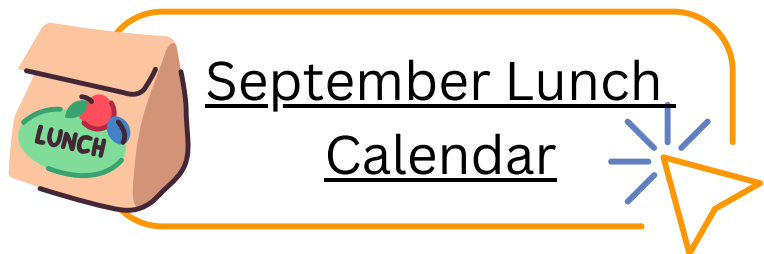

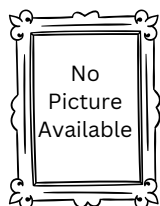


*Bridget Cackler 4th grade*

*Anderson Feld - P.E.*

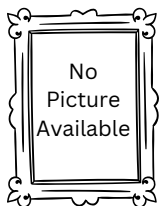

*Mayci Huggins - 6th grade*

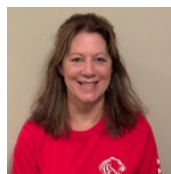

## Scrip Update:

**Create your free RaiseRight account in minutes to start earning**

A RaiseRight account gives you access to fundraise your way—simply by using gift cards on everyday purchases.

- Unlimited earning potential
- Earn more than shopping with credit cards
- Hundreds of popular brands to choose from



**Step 1: Get your enrollment code**

To sign up and tie your earnings to the correct fundraising program, you will be asked for your organization's unique enrollment code. If you don't have this, you can request it from your program's coordinator.

In addition to the enrollment code, you only need a few more details to sign up, including:

- Email address
- Phone number (for 2-step verification)

**Scrip Coordinator Update for 2024-2025**

**SCRIP UPDATE:** For the 2024-2025 school year, Scrip gift card rebates will be earned through e-gift cards on the Raise Right app and ship to home gift cards.

**We will not be offering a purchase from coordinator option.**

What is Scrip? Scrip is a fundraiser where you buy gift cards - at face value - for items you are already purchasing and a percentage of the total gift card is returned as a rebate. The PTO receives the first \$25 of rebates and then all rebates after that are split 50-50 with half going to the PTO, the other half being applied to your child's tuition the following school year. PTO uses this money to help take care of our teachers, put on events for your children and family, and purchase much needed supplies.

Does it take a little planning? YES! But it is so worth it! If used consistently, rebates REALLY do add up fast!
