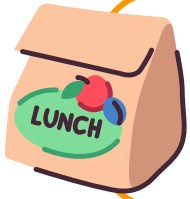
## A message from Father Tom Holder...

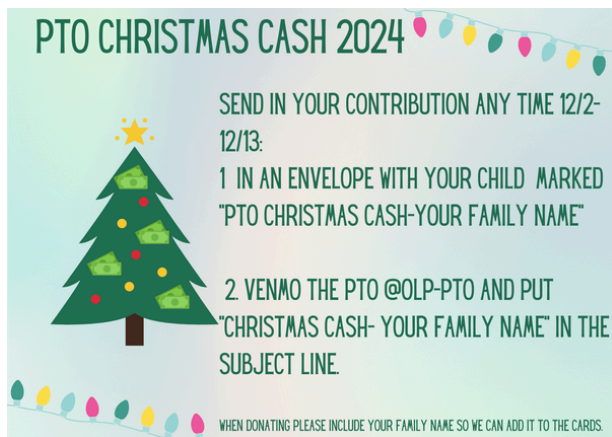




## Our PTO
