Meet Our Transition Partners

Parent to Parent is partnering with Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency (GVRA) on a project focused on improving employment outcomes for youth with disabilities. The E3 Project is being piloted in several Georgia school districts during the 2016-17 school year and Parent to Parent has hired Transition Partners to work with these districts. These E3 Project-funded positions are similar to our Regional Coordinator positions except they are focused on transition age youth, aged 14-24. Transition Partners work with local VR and school staff to provide one-on-one assistance, connect families to each other, provide resources and information and coordinate training and educational sessions to transition topics.
