Welcome to St. Mark's!

Whether this is your first time worshipping with us or not, you are welcome here without conditions or expectations!

Holy Eucharist!

God is our host and everyone is welcome to participate fully by receiving Holy Communion—even infants and small children.

The Episcopal Church believes the sacrament is complete even when only the bread is consumed. Due to the risks of COVID-19 only bread will be shared. Gluten-free hosts are available. Simply let the server know of your preference when they bring communion to you.

Music

We hope you enjoy the music in the service; Diocese of Chicago guidelines allow for a soloist but, as tempting as it may be, we please ask that you *do not join in singing* as it is not permitted under current guidelines. However, *humming is permitted and encouraged where indicated!*

Children of all ages are welcome in worship!

Parents are asked, however, to keep your child(ren) with you so that you can help them participate in worship and so we can maintain appropriate physical distancing.

About St. Mark's!

We believe that the spirit of God lives in every human being, and that we are called to glorify that which unites us while celebrating the awesome diversity of God's creations. All of us at St. Mark's share a commitment to our faith and to our community, and we welcome you regardless of religious background, race, sexual orientation, or gender identity. Everyone is welcome here.



Covenant for Re-Gathering

In response to the current COVID-19 pandemic, I promise, with God's help and to the best of my ability, to abide by the guidelines of the Diocese of Chicago for participation in the life of my congregation according to the regathering phase in which my congregation is authorized to carry out its mission and ministry.

In fulfillment of the Baptismal Covenant (*BCP* p. 304-305), I will strive to:

Love my neighbor as myself, I will...

- Wear a face covering over my nose and mouth at all times in church buildings, except momentarily to receive the sacrament and follow public health guidelines for hand sanitizing and disinfecting
- Only attend worship and receive communion if I am healthy and non-symptomatic with COVID-19 or any other contagious disease that could compromise the health of another congregant and to my knowledge have not been in direct contact with anyone infected
- Abstain from attending if doing so would put me at greater risk due to my own health status
- Inform the rector and/or wardens as soon as possible if I am diagnosed with the COVID-19 virus

Respect the dignity of every human being, I will...

- Make no physical contact with people beyond the members of my own household while on church property
- Ensure that children under my care remain with me at all times
- Maintain a six foot or more distance from other members of the congregation
- Respect any requests for distance, face covering, and cleaning, to ensure the safety and comfort level of others

Seek and serve Christ in all people...

- Trust and support the decisions of both my diocesan and congregational leaders
- Stay connected with others in my community by telephone, video chat, or mail

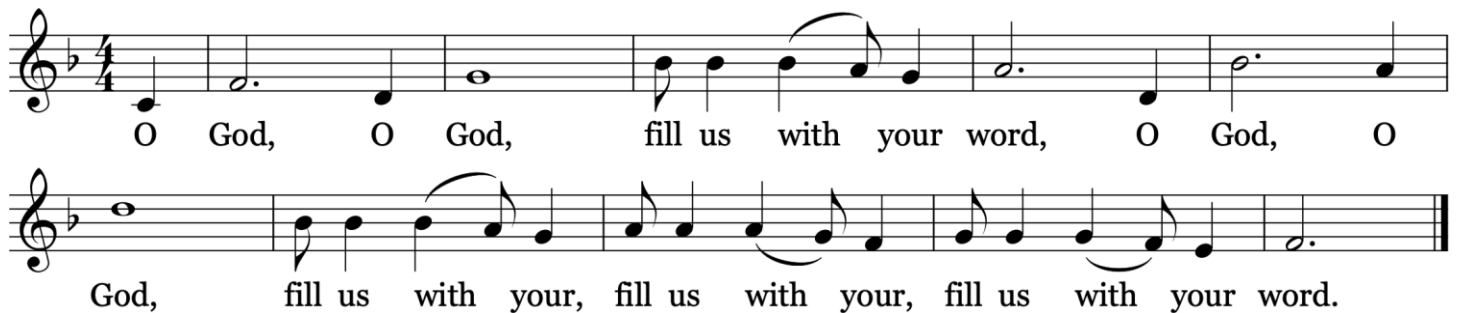

After each petition

Leader . . . We humbly praise you, Almighty God,

People **Alleluia! Amen!**

Presider If we confess our sins, the One who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness; therefore, let us confess our sins:

All **Almighty God, our heavenly Father:**
We have sinned against you,
through our own fault,
in thought, and word, and deed,
and in what we have left undone.
For the sake of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ,
forgive us all our offenses;
and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life,
to the glory of your Name. Amen.

People **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

...Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

*Please maintain a 6' distance and keep your mouth and nose covered when coming forward to receive communion.
When you return to your seat you may remove the mask to eat the host. Thank you.*
