

Leader: Lord of my heart, give me vision to inspire me, that, working or resting, I may always think of you.

All: **Lord of my heart, give me light to guide me, that, at home or abroad, I may always walk in your way.**

Leader: Lord of my heart, give me wisdom to direct me, that, thinking or

acting, I may always discern right and wrong.

**All: Lord of my heart, give me courage to strengthen me, that among friends or enemies, I may always proclaim your justice.**

**Leader: Lord of my heart, give me trust to console me, that, hungry or well-fed, I may always rely on your mercy.**

**All: Lord of my heart, save me from empty praise, that, I may always boast of you.**

**Leader: Lord of my heart, save me from worldly wealth, that I may always look to the riches of heaven.**

**All: Lord of my heart, save me from military prowess, that I may always seek your protection.**

**Leader: Lord of my heart, save me from vain knowledge, that I may always study our word.**

**All: Lord of my heart, save me from unnatural pleasures, that I may always find joy in your wonderful creation. Heart of my own heart, whatever may befall me, rule over my thoughts and feelings, my words my actions.**

## **FIRST READING— Psalm 23 (NLT) – On video**

## **SECOND READING— Genesis 32:22ff (NLT)**

“During the night Jacob got up and took his two wives, his two servant wives, and his eleven sons and crossed the Jabbok River with them. After taking them to the other side, he sent over all his possessions. This left Jacob all alone in the camp, and a man came and wrestled with him until the dawn began to break. When the man saw that he would not win the match, he touched Jacob’s hip and wrenched it out of its socket. Then the man said, “Let me go, for the dawn is breaking!” But Jacob said, “I will not let you go unless you bless me.” “What is your name?” the man asked. He replied, “Jacob.” “Your name will no longer be Jacob,” the man told him. “From now on you will be called Israel, because you have fought with God and with men and have won.” “Please tell me your name,” Jacob said. “Why do you want to know my name?” the man replied. Then he blessed Jacob there. Jacob named the place Peniel (which means “face of God”), for he said, “I have seen God face to face, yet my life has been spared.” The sun was rising as Jacob left Peniel, and he was limping because of the injury to his hip.”

Reader: This is the reading of the Word of the Lord.

**People: Thanks be to God.**

Reader: For God so loved the world that He sent His only Son to give us life.

**People: Jesus is the Word of God who was made flesh and dwells among us full of the grace and truth of God.**

## **HOLY GOSPEL—John 9:1-7, 13-17, 34-39 (NLT)**

John writes, “As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. “Rabbi,” his disciples asked him, “why was this man born blind? Was it because of his own sins or his parents’ sins?” “It was not because of his sins or his parents’ sins,” Jesus answered. “This happened so the power of God could be seen in him. We must quickly carry out the tasks assigned us by the one who sent us. The night is coming, and then no one can work. But while I am here in the world, I am the light of the world.” Then he spit on the ground, made mud with the saliva, and spread the mud over the blind man’s eyes. He told him, “Go wash yourself in the pool of Siloam” (Siloam means “sent”). So the man went and washed and came back seeing! Then they took the man who had been blind to the Pharisees, because it was on the Sabbath that Jesus had made the mud and healed him. The Pharisees asked the man all about it. So he told them, “He put the mud over my eyes, and when I washed it away, I could see!” Some of the Pharisees said, “This man Jesus is not from God, for he is working on the Sabbath.” Others said, “But how could an ordinary sinner do such miraculous signs?” So there was a deep division of opinion among them. Then the Pharisees again questioned the man who had been blind and demanded, “What’s your opinion about this man who healed you?” “You were born a total sinner!” they answered. “Are you trying to teach us?” And they threw him out of the synagogue. When Jesus heard what had happened, he found the man and asked, “Do you believe in the Son of Man?” The man answered, “Who is he, sir? I want to believe in him.” “You have seen him,” Jesus said, “and he is speaking to you!” “Yes, Lord, I believe!” the man said. And he worshiped Jesus. Then Jesus told him, “I entered this world to render judgment—to give sight to the blind and to show those who think they see[e] that they are blind.”

Reader: This is the reading from the Gospel of the Lord.

**People: Praise to You, O Christ.**

- ALL: AND FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES, AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US.**
- Leader: We know the devil seeks to destroy our souls and the world lures us to ruin by appealing to the desires of our flesh. Guard us from the poison of misbelief and the trap of unrepented sin.
- ALL: AND LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION.**
- Leader: Keep safe our bodies and souls, our property and honor, and above all send the Holy Spirit to preserve our faith in Christ which leads to life everlasting.
- ALL: BUT DELIVER US FROM EVIL.**
- Leader: For all these petitions we look to you as King of Kings and Lord of your people.
- ALL: FOR THINE IS THE KINGDOM,**
- Leader: You alone hold the power to grant our requests.
- ALL: AND THE POWER,**
- Leader: We worship you from whom all blessings flow.
- ALL: AND THE GLORY FOREVER AND EVER.**
- Leader: Relying on Jesus, who cancelled our sins and made us acceptable in your sight, we pray with confidence:
- ALL: AMEN. IT SHALL BE SO.**
