- Know the etiology, epidemiology and lifespan impact of neural tube defects on children and their families.
- Gain understanding of developmentally oriented programs to enhance adjustment, family relationships, self-management and transitions for kids with spina bifida.
- Understand physical therapy role and strategies for improving function and mobility in children with spina bifida, including equipment and bracing modalities.
- Describe the unique learning needs of children with spina bifida from a neurobiological approach and provide strategies to support their special early learning needs.
- Understand and manage common nutrition and feeding issues in children with spina bifida.
