

Compassion and Community: Supporting People with Opioid Use Disorder to Recover

Presenters Cheryl Gagne and Steven Samra, senior trainers and people in long-term recovery, will provide background information about opioid use disorder (OUD), the stigma associated with getting help, and how communities can support their members and their families struggling with opioids to access resources to find treatment and a pathway to recovery.

- Barriers to treatment and recovery support (including lack of hope and connection and ignorance and prejudice about OUD)
