A Clients Story.....

In February we had a young client to come into the Center for a pregnancy test. The usual visit of 30-40 minutes lasted over two hours. This client after talking with Melissa, asked many questions dealing with the health and development of her baby. She also asked many questions about a relationship with Jesus. Every client is asked to fill out an exit survey as we use to help better serve the needs of our clients. On her survey she made these remarks, "the Center was comforting and informative." she said the client advocate gave me lots of answers to my questions." she asks for prayer that "I continue to do the right thing and grow a strong relationship with God and that I bestow those beliefs to my baby. The most telling thing about the exit survey was how she rated DBPCC . The rating scale goes from 1(strongly disagree). To 5 (strongly agree.). On the clients survey she rated the center from 7-10. She made this comment, "I know that it is 1 through 5 but I really appreciate the service. Thanks, from the bottom of my heart!" After her initial visit with us, she started attending educational parenting classes and earning her Baby Bucks for material support. Continue to pray for her as she goes through her pregnancy and that she continues to make the right decisions that will be the best for her and her baby.

Earn While you learn is based on a simple belief that providing useful knowledge ad aid to those I crisis pregnancies is a vital part of a successful PRC. By teaching the skills a young woman needs along with supplies items that can help her be a successful Mother. EWYL empowers the PRCs to offer a real ad meaningful choice to those who choose life. The program also builds relationship's, gives real skills that will impact generations, and creates openings for the counselor to share Christ. EWYL is not just curriculum, it is a way of making real and permanent changes for the good of the client and the center.

A Hand Up.....

EWYL was designed from the beginning to change the paradigms for a generation that has grown up o handouts. Instead of giving away items to anyone who ask, the EWYL program allows the client to “earn” the items through learning how to be a better parent. The double-pronged method gives value to the items given away while imparting knowledge that will ultimately prepare clients to be responsible and able mothers to their children. Plus, hundreds of centers have found that their clients have a sese of pride and accomplishments I the work they are doing ad how their parenting is improving.

How it works

The concept is simple. When a client completes a lesson, they are rewarded with “Mommy Money.” When they return their homework, they receive more. They are the able to “shop” in the PRC Mommy Store for items they need. The store is normally stocked with donations of diapers, clothes for the baby ad mother, cribs, new car seats and more.

Why It Works

EWYL works because it empowers both the client’s ad volunteers. The volunteers are able to create relationships, impart wisdom, provide for needs, and make a lifelog impact on the clients. The success in the volunteer/client relationship creates volunteers who know that their work is important ad understand that they are making a difference.

EWY Works with clients because the successes they achieve in both the program and in their personal lives when they apply the lessons gives them a sense of accomplishment.

EWYL is not a program to clients; it is an important tool for them as well as a opportunity to sped time with someone who cares for them. The skills they learn and the relationships they develop make the time spent both valuable and important I their lives.

Why is it important

EWYL is important because it provides the backing to promises made while a client is deciding between abortion and life. Most clients see a scary road ahead if they keep the child. They normally face subtle threats from the boyfriend and worries of inadequacy. This creates serous worries ad doubts.

When counselors are workie to convince clients that the baby is alive, the fears of the future also need to be addressed. EWYL gives answers to those fears. The I cat be a mother” can be answered with, “We can help you learn how” and the “I cat make it alone” can lead to a response of, ‘We will be here to help you. EWYL provides the tools that the young clients know they need- ad it helps them choose life because they see a possible road forward.
