

Daybreak Pregnancy Resource Center

The Daybreak Pregnancy Resource Center was established in 2011 with a mission to reach women in the community through life-affirming pregnancy resources and support. We do this by providing a variety of free services to patients and their families. The Center started in 2011 in Cordele, servicing three counties, Dooly, Wilcox and Crisp. This was Cordele Pregnancy Center. In 2018 the center was relocated to Vienna, and the name was changed to Daybreak Pregnancy Resource Center. Daybreak provides many services, including pregnancy testing. We also provide support through a variety of classes and resources to meet basic needs, including a support group for dads as well as group and individual studies for those who have experienced reproductive loss, such as miscarriage or abortion, or child loss.

The **Pregnancy Care Center is a 501c (3) organization** to assist women facing unplanned pregnancies. We provide free services including pregnancy tests, counselling options, referrals, and resources as well. We lovingly and accurately discuss all options so our clients can make an informed choice. Learn and Earn is a key program at the center which allows parents to learn the skills they need while earning credit towards brand new baby items from our baby store. The Pregnancy Care Center is funded by businesses, churches, fundraising, and individuals in our community. DBPRC, Daybreak, does not have paid staff,

The Executive Director, could be in a paid position if there were enough funds. Daybreaks Director will not accept any pay for being the Director, she states she is in the Ministry and missions to make a difference in someone's life, we are totally run by volunteers.

We are only One Decision Away from Changing Someone, s Life, as The Director of Daybreak, we have made a difference in many lives of a mother and newborn baby and others.

We are a volunteer-driven ministry and are always seeking help in areas providing services meeting individually with patients to provide caring support, mentoring clients who participate in classes, mentoring dads, organizing and keeping the clothes closet, raising funds, and meeting a variety of other needs.

We were on a mission this month May, with open house for all mothers, a celebration for Mother's Day. We had 57 Mothers attending and touring the Center. Each Mother was given a Mother's Day Gift; Card and lunch was provided for each. We had seven young ladies that signed up for parenting classes and car seat training.

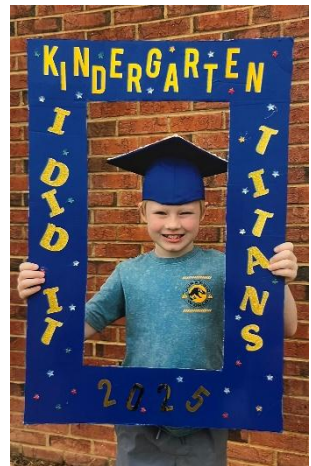

The Georgia Diaper Distribution Program

The Go-DDDRP is a 2-year initiative providing free diapers to eligible families. To qualify, households must meet CSBG or Federal Poverty Guidelines. Diapers are distributed monthly across eight counties: Crisp, Dooly, Macon, Marion, Schley, Sumter, Taylor, and Webster.

Required Documents for Eligibility
 If you qualify for the program, you must provide the following documents:

1. Identification (ID) – A valid government-issued ID is required for every household member who is 18 years or older.
2. Social Security Cards (SSN) – You must provide Social Security Cards for everyone in the household, including children. No exceptions will be made.
3. Proof of Income – If there is another adult (18+) in the household who has an income, they must provide proof of income as well.
