Subject: Notification of Proposed Inspection Fee Changes for 2026

Based on an increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Fiscal Year 2025, the Michigan Commission of Agriculture and Rural Development (the Commission) will be considering an increase in fees charged for nursery stock, Christmas tree, export, import, and other inspections. If approved, hourly-based fees will increase from \$74 per hour to \$75 per hour. Acreage-based fees will increase from \$67 to \$68 for the first acre, and from \$40 to \$41 for each additional acre. The fee increase will become effective January 1, 2026 and remain in effect through December 31, 2026.

The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) charges fees for inspection of plants and plant products as authorized under Public Act 189 of 1931, Insect Pests and Plant Diseases. Act 189 requires MDARD to evaluate its inspection costs annually and authorizes increases of inspection fees by not more than an amount determined by the State Treasurer to reflect the cumulative annual percentage change in the Detroit-Ann Arbor-Flint (now called the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn) CPI over the previous one-year period, with the adjustment not to exceed 5%. Fee increases are subject to approval by the Commission.

The State Treasurer reported to MDARD a 2.1% increase in the CPI for Fiscal Year 2025. Based on this, MDARD is requesting the Commission to approve an increase in inspection fees at its November 5, 2025 meeting.
