TODAY'S PROGRAM... *Meals On Wheels*

Today's program was all about Ann Arbor Meals on Wheels, formerly called Motor Meals. Our speakers were Courtney Vanderlaan, Director, and Katrina Boulter, Volunteer Coordinator. MOW delivers meals to individuals who are homebound because of health issues, regardless of age or economic status. It is a service provided by Michigan Medicine. In some cases the MOW volunteer is the only person the recipient will see all day.

MOW started delivering meals in Ann Arbor in 1974 and currently has 18 routes serviced from the Traverwood location every Monday through Saturday. MOW has also recently been helping clients with yard cleanups. The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor services MOW route #9 Monday through Friday. 33 members are actively involved as well as some volunteers. In 2019 450 volunteers drove 94,164 miles while delivering 136,861 meals. Katrina said that additional volunteers are needed, and a volunteer application can be found [online](#). Kiwanis MOW Co-chair **Chris Winkler** added that additional volunteers would be great. Contact Chris if you are interested in being on the team.

- **Application and Supporting Documents must be received NO LATER THAN: Midnight, MARCH 13, 2020.**

- **Grant Applications will not be accepted at the Kiwanis Center. No Late Grant Applications will be considered.**
