TODAY'S PROGRAM... 2020 Census Update

Dale Leslie introduced and reacquainted us with Margaret Leary, who spoke today on behalf of the League of Women Voters about the upcoming 2020 Census. Margaret has spoken at Kiwanis twice before, on the topics of gerrymandering and also about one of the UM Law School's most generous and interesting benefactors, William W. Cook, who contributed the Law Quadrangle to the University. Margaret retired in 2011 as Director of the UM Law School Library and is now a freelance writer.

The 2020 Census begins in March, with the Official Census Day of April 1, although it has already begun in Alaska, where access to remote areas is only possible while the ground is frozen. This time around, the Census questionnaire is short and simple (there is no longer a "long form," which in the past had a lower response rate). Margaret provided an actual copy of the 2020 Census to everyone present. There is no citizenship question, and the questionnaire may be completed on paper, by phone or through the internet. Answers are strictly confidential and may be used only to produce statistical information. A companion "Counting for Dollars 2020" Project began a few years ago, and, among other things, analyzes the extent to which the Census determines distribution of federal funding to states and localities. For example, in fiscal year 2016, Michigan received slightly more than \$29 billion through 55 federal spending programs guided by 2010 Census data.

In addition to determining the allocation of federal funding, the 2020 Census will determine each state's representation in Congress from 2022 through 2032. Michigan currently has 14 representatives in Congress, although this may drop to 13 based on the 2020 Census. Each state uses Census data to draw legislative district lines. Many states and local governmental units also use Census data to decide such things as where to put new housing and whether to repair old infrastructure. In the private sector, business planning decision makers and academic or think-tank researchers make use of Census data.

Interested in participating? Census Bureau temporary workers earn \$23 per hour. Almost any question can be answered with the search: **[your question] 2020 site:census.gov**. For example, try **where are college students counted 2020 site:census.gov**.

SCHOLARSHIPS FUNDED...

Jim Dries and Dan Burroughs, co-chairs of the Scholarship Committee, called Dr. Rose Bellanca, President of Washtenaw Community College, to the podium, and, together with **Pres Dan**, presented a check to WCC in the amount of \$36,000. This is the second check toward our total contribution in 2019-2020 of \$72,000 for Finish Line Scholarships. These scholarships provide full ride scholarships to 20 WCC students, funding not only tuition, books and fees but also emergency fund support to handle unexpected financial challenges that might otherwise prevent the recipients' continued enrollment at WCC. Dr. Bellanca expressed her sincere thanks and introduced Andrew Wattles, a Finish Line scholarship recipient, who lunched with us today accompanied by his father, Rev. George Waddles.


