## TODAY'S PROGRAM... *George F. Hixson Fellowship Awards Ceremony*

**Bob Carr** introduced today's program as being the Induction of three Kiwanians as Hixson Fellows in recognition of their outstanding contributions to Kiwanis and to the community as Kiwanians and citizens. **Bob** told us a little bit of the Hixson Award history and said that it was named for the first President of Kiwanis. **Bob** said that a major task of the Member Recognition Committee is to identify people, particularly Club members, to become Hixson Fellows. The members of this committee are: **Dick Benedek, Bob Carr, Harry Cross, Claire Dahl, Larry French, Bob Gray, William Hampton, Lynne Lande, Anne Mattson, Peter Schork, Ellen Webb, Kathie Wilder and Max Ziegler**. This year the committee has selected 9 Kiwanis members to be inducted as Hixson Fellows. Of these, we induct 3 today, 3 more on January 11, 2021 and 3 more on February 8, 2021.

**Bob** then asked **Bob Gray** to induct **Ray Argyle** as a Hixson Fellow. **Ray** was seated next to **Bob** at **Bob's** house. **Bob** gave us a summary of **Ray's** life growing up in North Dakota, where he learned the value of working early on. **Ray's** first job, when he was 6, was pulling weeds around tree seedlings for 35 cents an hour. He also had a paper route. His mother took the money he earned and bought U.S. Savings Bonds for him. He later used that to help pay for college tuition. While attending North Dakota State University, where he majored in Biology and Math and had a minor in

Chemistry, **Ray** met the love of his life, Diane, who was a Botany and Zoology major. After graduating from NDSU, he got a Master's Degree from Colorado State University in Fisheries and Statistics. **Ray** and Diane married in 1965 and their daughter, Kathleen, was born in 1966. In July of 1972, Ray interviewed for and got a job at the Fisheries Lab on Green Road in Ann Arbor. **Bob** met **Ray** 48 years ago at Allen Elementary School when they both had kids attending there in first grade. In 2009, **Bob** sponsored **Ray** to become a Kiwanian. **Ray** then started volunteering in the electronics department where he worked with **Bill Robb**, doing repairs and pricing items for sale. **Ray** has served two terms on the Kiwanis Board of Directors. He has delivered Meals on Wheels for 12 years, he has chaired or co-chaired the Attendance

## TODAY'S PROGRAM CONTUNUED...HIXSON FELLOW AWARDS



**Bob Carr** next asked **Anne Mattson** to induct **Margaret Krasnoff**, left, as a Hixson Fellow. **Anne** said that it would be her pleasure to do just that. **Anne** commented that while she was not as near to **Margaret** as **Bob & Ray** were (as she was over a thousand miles away) they are together in spirit. **Anne** said that it was her extreme honor and pleasure to present our Club President, **Margaret Krasnoff** with the Hixson Fellow award. **Anne** said that **Margaret** was born in and grew up in Flint, MI and is a graduate of the University of Michigan. Prior to going to law school, **Margaret** directed programs at the UM for developmentally disabled children and adults. She also directed programs aimed at encouraging young women to pursue careers in science and engineering. When she was in her forties, **Margaret** decided it was time to go to law school. While going to the Detroit College of Law, she clerked for the three judges of the 15<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court in Ann Arbor, one of them being **Anne**. Her work included doing legal research and drafting legal opinions. **Anne** said that in reviewing **Margaret's** work, she can attest from personnel experience as to how detailed and thorough **Margaret's** work is. After **Margaret** graduated from Law School, **Anne** had the honor of swearing in **Margaret** as a member of the State Bar of Michigan. **Margaret** has practiced Law in Ann Arbor for more than 20 years. **Anne** said that 'The cream rises to the top' and, in the case of **President Margaret**, that is certainly true. **Anne** said that **Margaret** joined Kiwanis in 2015 and has served as the Chair of the Grant Coordination and Operations Committees. She is Co-Chair of the Archive, KEEP and Bylaws Committees. She has also served on the Strategic & Long-range Planning Committee, Children and Youth Services Committee, Attendance and Reception Committee, and Outreach Committee. She was also a very valuable resource person for the Ethics Committee. **Margaret** was elected to the Board of Directors in 2017 and she is currently President of our Club and Foundation. **Margaret** and her husband, Justin, are parents to daughter Valerie. A little known fact about **Margaret** is that she is an amazing Tap Dancer. She's been a member of a local tap dancing group for 25 years and she has performed with her group at the 'Top of the Park'. She also enjoys making and collecting doll house miniatures. **Anne** then inducted **Margaret** as a Hixson Fellow.

**Bob** then asked **Lynne Lande** to induct **Jean Robinson**, right, as a Hixson Fellow. **Lynne** described **Jean** as being born with a sensitive, caring spirit which was nurtured by her family and her life experiences. **Lynne** said that **Jean** is the youngest of 10 children. She grew up in rural Edwardsville, VA. She describes her family as warm and supportive. They had a strong sense of community and were willing to help others. One story that **Jean** shared with **Lynne** was about a World War II government allotment program for families of service members. She remembers her family helping neighbors complete the required paperwork in order to receive their allotment. When **Jean** was ready for high school, her parents felt she would have more opportunities by attending a residential high school in NC. **Jean** found that her classmates sought her out and confided in her. Perhaps this was the stirring of her calling to go into social work. **Jean** then went on to Virginia Union University, a small, private Black school in Richmond Virginia. Her uncle was the first African American President of that University. **Jean** lived in her uncle's home on campus and had many wonderful experiences there, including meeting Marian Anderson, Adam Clayton Powell and Benjamin Mayes. They were some of the guests that came to speak at the University...because of segregation, they stayed in the President's home. Inspired by a dignitary who had stayed at her uncle's home and who had described the UM and Ann Arbor, **Jean** decided to get her graduate degree in Social Work here. In those days, the dormitories at Michigan were segregated so she stayed at a house near campus that accepted African American students. **Jean** obtained her MSW and was recruited to work at the UM Medical Center. During her more than 30-year career as a Medical Social Worker, she became interested in Psychosomatic Medicine, which address the impact of social environment on health. She worked her way up to become the Director of Medical Social Work. **Jean** served on several local non-profit boards with her friend Latisha Byrd. She was elected to the Ann Arbor City Council for a two-year term in 2000. **Jean** also was a member of the Citizens Advisory Group for Community Block Grants. There she met **Clarence Dukes**, who encouraged her to join Kiwanis. **Jean** has served on many Kiwanis committees. She has enjoyed reviewing grant proposals and working in the Voucher Program. She has delivered Meals on Wheels with **Lloyd Kitchens**. She has served on the Honorary Members Committee, the Greater Years Committee, and she has been a greeter and a cashier. She enjoyed ringing bells for the Salvation Army with **Dave Bell**. She has served on the Ethics Committee, where she helped create the 'Code of Conduct' for the Club and Foundation. **Lynne** closed by saying that it was her honor to present the George W. Hixson Fellow award to **Jean**. **Lynne** planned to visit **Jean** and present her award to her in person on Tuesday.



**Bob Carr** then congratulated our new Hixson Award Honorees and looks forward to inducting more honorees in January and February. We're honored to have you all as members of our Club.

## SMOC COVID OPERATING RULES AND PROCEDURES

Adopted on November 3, 2020. These rules and procedures are subject to review and modification.

The following rules were established by SMOC as an update of operating procedures and COVID-19 safety measures, allowing sales operations to increase the number of hours and weekdays that volunteers and members may work in the building in areas of sorting, pricing and stocking merchandise as well as assisting with the Voucher program. References to the "building" in this document are to the space occupied by the Kiwanis Foundation and Thrift Sale only.

These rules seek to comply with Michigan Health Department guidelines and MIOSHA regulations, issued October 14, 2020, requiring employers with employees/workers on site during the COVID pandemic to implement certain procedures to avoid unnecessary exposure of any person to the COVID virus and to maintain a safe work environment. SMOC may further modify these rules to comply with changes in federal, state and local regulations governing retail operations during the COVID pandemic.

These rules apply to Kiwanis members, volunteers and employees ("workers").

1. Thrift Sale and other workers coming into the Kiwanis building must participate in a daily health screening upon entry including a questionnaire and temperature screening. (Mario, Tanya, Liesel or any member of SMOC may conduct a screening protocol for persons entering the building). Self-screening is no longer allowed under updated health regulations.

2. Mario and Tanya are designated Safety Officers, and Liesel is an Assistant Safety Officer. At least one Safety Officer must be on site at all times when workers are in the building.

3. Kiwanis requires 6 feet of separation between workers and/or barriers and floor markers to designate individual work stations. Mario to designate the number of persons allowed in any area at one time with signs and other indicia placed at work spaces as necessary.

4. Face coverings must be worn at all times by everyone in the building. Masks or shields must completely cover the nose and mouth. Anyone observing non-compliance is encouraged to bring the lack of properly worn face covering to the worker's attention, requesting that the mask or shield be properly worn, and reporting any refusal to do so to a Safety Officer.

5. Members and volunteers must complete a new MEI Form, a Health Risk Assessment Form, a COVID-19 Training Session and be approved by Mario before being scheduled to work in the building.

6. The building will be open Monday through Friday from 9:00am until 1:00pm for scheduled workers (members/volunteers) to sort, price and stock merchandise. Members and volunteers should be assigned in advance to a designated work day before being permitted to enter the building, subject to authorized exceptions. Paid employees may work different days and hours, as scheduled by the Sales Manager and/or the Building Committee.

7. Members/volunteers should arrive no earlier than 9:00am and enter through Door 15 (north end of East Dock) to Check-In on the Attendance iPad, get temperature taken and answer COVID-19 related questions by Liesel Baker. Members/Volunteers must leave the building at 1:00 pm when the work shift ends, unless specific advance arrangements have been made. (Note: 9:00am arrival allows Sales and Building employees to arrive/check in before members/volunteers arrive. The 1:00pm closing for members/volunteers allows Sales and Building employees to complete closing activities and check out at their assigned times).

-Mario/his designee shall designate & schedule members/volunteers for each department for sorting, pricing and Sale days.

-Bob Gray and Ellen Webb or their designee, shall schedule Volunteers at Check-Out stations, including Cashiers, Backup Cashiers, Packers, Backup Packers, the Host Monitor, the Door Monitors and Parking Lot Volunteers. Bob, working with Peter Schork, shall schedule workers for the parking lot, including donation intake workers, parking lot attendees, and line supervisors.

-Schedules should be sent out in advance by Bob and Mario.

-Bob Gray and Ellen Webb shall also schedule workers for the Voucher Program. Schedules should be sent out in advance by Bob.

8. Subject to permitted exceptions, operations and scheduling for each day of the week for volunteers and members, exclusive of paid staff, shall be as follows, subject to changes based on experience, needs and the potential for opening sales on Fridays:

-**Monday:** members/volunteers with no health restrictions may be scheduled to work;

-**Tuesday:** members/volunteers with moderate health risks scheduled to work;

-**Wednesday:** members/volunteers with higher health risks scheduled to work;

-**Thursday:** scheduling for areas of the sales floor in which voucher clients will be shopping are limited to voucher program workers. Members/volunteers who work directly with social workers and voucher clients may not be scheduled to work on the Friday or Saturday following any Thursday they've work on Vouchers. Voucher clients and their social worker shall be responsible for loading purchased goods and removing them from the premises without assistance from paid staff.

-**Friday:** members/volunteers with no health restrictions may be scheduled to work;

-**Saturday** -Thrift Sale open to the public with members/volunteers to arrive at building at scheduled times;

-**Sunday:** building closed subject to exceptions determined by the Sales Manager.

If a member/volunteer of the Prep Group or a Sale Day worker assigned to the sales floor cannot work a scheduled shift, he/she is asked to contact Mario as soon as possible so another person can be scheduled for that shift. Cashiers and other Sale Day Volunteers working in the area of the cash registers should contact Bob and/or Ellen if they cannot work as scheduled.

Individual workers shall not work in the building alone. The "two-person" rule applies to all persons other than the Safety Officers, meaning that two members/volunteers in the same department or work area must be working at the same time, provided a Safety Officer is also in the building. A Safety Officer may not be counted as the "second" person for application of this rule.

Members/volunteers who violate these rules or choose not to observe them will be given a warning and a reminder that these rules are mandatory and put in place for the health and safety of everyone in the Kiwanis building. A second violation will result in the member/volunteer being suspended from working. The length of the suspension, terms of return, and/or disqualification from working shall be determined by the Sales Manager, with a review, if requested, by SMOC.
