Recognizing his great faith and wisdom and the host of relationships he has formed in the parish, he will remain available as “senior priest,” offering pastoral and sacramental ministry as circumstances permit, given the current climate surrounding the Covid-19 pandemic and his own personal health needs. 
As a result, Saint Augustin Parish will have one full-time priest on staff, with more limited ability to rely on the retired priests who have assisted regularly at daily and weekend Masses, weddings, and funerals. With a single priest, you are called to rely on the four deacons, parish staff, school staff, and the entire community to do your part to carry out the parish’s mission to be and serve Christ’s Body.

One additional staff change I have asked be adopted that will assist Fr. Christopher and the fulfillment of your mission is to expand the scope of Business Manager Randy Mudge’s responsibilities. His reconfigured position will be Director of Parish Life. Fr. Vince Rosonke will assist you and parish leadership in conveying details of this proposed staffing plan. Please pray for evangelically bold hearts and minds that will embrace this new chapter in your parish’s storied life.

I want to thank Fr. Rosonke for his generosity in stepping out of retirement to serve as administrator of your parish for these many months. He will “love to the end” of his time among you by doing all he can to enable a smooth transition for Fr. Pisut and your parish community.

Again, thank you for your understanding over these past months. It is my firm hope that these developments will equip St. Augustin parish to be an ever more vibrant parish and pillar within our Des Moines diocesan family.
