Please also contact your representatives in government and urge the following:

- Urge the creation of a humanitarian corridor. **Gazans need water, food, and fuel.** Of the 2.2. million inhabitants of Gaza, 50% are 19 years old or under. Children are not to blame for Hamas' brutality.
- **Oppose dehumanization** and dehumanizing language. Affirm the sanctity of all life! There has been dangerous rhetoric that dehumanizes entire populations.
- **Condemn all war crimes**, whoever commits them, Hamas' targeting of civilians is a war crime. Collective punishment, including starving populations, cutting off water for days, and bombing civilian centers, are also war crimes. In the days and weeks ahead, we fear this may get worse.
- De-escalation is in Israel's interest; **Israelis want the hostages to come home.**
- The current conflict runs the risk of broadening into **a regional conflict or war.** We need to be aware of potential for regional or broader international involvement that would be very dangerous.
