Growing a Year-Round Hummingbird Habitat Garden

And a bonus: Robin will share day-by-day images of her experience following a nesting hummingbird from nest building to baby fledglings.

Robin is a Seattle-based garden coach and award-winning garden designer. She is the founder of <u>Garden Mentors</u>, and has a passion for empowering individuals to cultivate sustainable, organically focused, native-inspired, and often edible spaces. Robin inspires people to foster a deeper connection to the natural world. She has appeared internationally on her award-winning garden design episode of HGTV's *Landscaper's Challenge*, and she is featured in multiple episodes of PBS' *Growing a Greener World*.
