EARLY CHILDHOOD KEHILLAH

Our Early Childhood program is a community that values exploration and play. We create a rich and nurturing environment filled with discovery, where children's innate curiosity and creativity are respected. Using natural and open-ended materials our students' days are filled with opportunities to explore, question, and observe the wonder in their worlds. The student's point of view is cherished as they are encouraged to take ownership of their space and classroom filling it with play, artwork, and experiential learning. Inspired by the Reggio-Emilia approach, our teachers facilitate in-depth learning and discovery, incorporating math, literacy, Judaics, and science into the fabric of the classrooms. Weaving together both General and Judaic studies, our programs are designed to develop the skills, both academic and social-emotional, that our students will need as they continue on their journey through Schechter Bergen.





1–4 KEHILLOT

Peek into any of our 1-4 Kehillot classrooms in the morning, and you will see children sitting in a circle for their "morning meeting," turning to face each other, making eye contact, and greeting each other with a "Boker Tov." This act of seeing each other and being seen, a key component of our Responsive Classroom approach, is the foundation of the children bonding as a Kehillah (community) and creates an environment where students can do their best learning. Students' developing skills in Hebrew allow them to participate joyfully in daily *tefillah* (prayer) and connect with the stories and traditions of the Jewish people. Through small and dynamic differentiated groups and individualized attention in multiple curricular areas, including Hebrew, math, writing and reading, teachers foster academic achievement and stimulate critical thinking. They nurture strong relationships with each student, creating an environment of trust and growth in which students take ownership of their learning.



5-8 KEHILLOT

For students in the 5-8 Kehillot the early adolescent years are a time of discovery. Using a Responsive Classroom approach, we encourage our students to remain open minded and curious to new experiences and knowledge, helping them to build meaningful connections and develop respectful and trusting relationships. Students develop spiritually through daily tefillah and delve into the stories of our sacred texts to become independent and engaged students of the Tanakh, Mishnah and Gemara. They strengthen their creative, scientific, mathematical, and design-thinking skills through a variety of engaging self-directed and collaborative projects. Students are challenged with material that develops analytical skills and deepens an orientation towards Tikkun Olam (making the world a better place). As they embark on the next step of their educational journey, Schechter Bergen students leave our campus with a strong sense of self and the courage and passion to forge their own path.
