



CASP LEARNING COMMUNITY CO-FACILITATOR POSITION

CASP is hiring Once-a-Week Learning Community (OLC) Co-Facilitators. Ideal candidates should be interested in supporting first-year students' transition to college in a weekly small group setting; co-facilitators will also need to be comfortable leading small group discussions and should have familiarity with the Chancellor's Associate Scholars Program (CASP). OLC Co-Facilitators are responsible for the following:

- Co-facilitate OLC seminars with a CASP professional staff member.
- Attend group training meetings.
- Facilitate a few of the seminar sessions.
- Help to plan seminars.
- Maintain consistent communication with seminar students
 - Email/call students to remind them about seminar related information.
 - Communicate with students during and outside of seminars (answer questions, send reminders, etc.).
- Paperwork
 - Keep attendance records.
 - Put together worksheets for group work.
 - Timesheets and other paperwork as assigned.
- Co-Facilitators work time will consist of:
 - OLC seminar time (1 hour/week)
 - Weekly prep with CASP professional staff member, and over the week (1-3 hours/week)
 - OLC training meetings (Varies – no more than 5 hours a Quarter)
- Other duties as assigned

Candidates must be available to work a minimum of 3 - 5 hours per week, beginning early January throughout the end of the academic year. Candidates must have completed at least 3 Quarters at UC San Diego.

Compensation: \$13.00/Hour
