February is a hard month in Ohio. Winter releases its grasp, but the skies remain interminably gloomy. The Old English name for this month, *Solmonath*, is descriptively accurate, literally "Mud Month." But our calendar comes to us from Rome, and this month of *Februarius which* means it is the month for purification.

Modern Americans do not like the idea of purification much. First, it implies that we are somehow polluted. Second, it requires some sort of change or transformation on our part, and we would rather not be bothered. And third, purification suggests that there is some condition of state of being that we have not yet achieved that is preferable to what we are.

One of the theological synchronicities of our calendar is that Lent begins in most years in February (yes, I know it won't next year). Lent is a 40-day season from the ancient rhythms of the church that emphasizes self-examination, consideration, and prayer. Traditionally it was presented as a season for feeling really guilty. I would like to suggest something different.

Self-examination is much more than self-recrimination. What if we used this season to carefully reflect on the story of our lives, perhaps even writing them down, to see how our stories connect up with God's story. What were the decisive turning points that made you, you? How has accident, change, or providence played a role? Looking at your story, how have you changed as a character within it? And finally, how do you see God working in all of this?

This ancient practice is the spiritual discipline of examen, and it follows a simple pattern. Find a quiet comfortable place, breathe deeply, put your feet on the floor, now begin with thanksgiving, something you are grateful for. Hold it in your mind and heart before God. It could be something so simple as a good cup of tea. Second, ask God for the wisdom to know yourself and to know yourself as God knows you. Third, reflect upon your day and what has happened. What brought joy and delight? What brought trouble or challenges? Where did I pause over a moment, feeling, or decision? Where did I feel the energy of my life today? And finally, have I noticed God's presence or action in any of this? We hold our stories before the narrator of lives and conclude our little reflection by considering what we may want to bring over to tomorrow.

Lent is not about feeling guilty for 40 days (but if you have really done something awful you might want to work on that). Instead, let it be all about hearing your story as a part of God's story. In that story is life.



MISSION BEYOND THE CONGREGATION





This winter we'll be having a Minute for Mission on the nonprofit organization Brigid's Path, one of the several organizations included in our Mission Team's annual budget. Their primary goal is to care for infants born exposed to addictive substances like opioids or prescription medication. This organization is the first facility in Ohio to offer in-patient treatment in a facility designed to feel like home. Brigid's Path has offered 24/7 care from skilled medical staff and volunteers to 213 babies since December 2017. They also partner with other community resources to support moms, encouraging mothers to room with, care for, and bond with their babies as much as possible to provide them with the long-term stability their child will need. She'll be sharing updates and ways for Fairmont members to get involved. There is also a chili cookoff sponsored by Women of Fairmont following the 10:30 a.m. worship service, so join us for worship, fellowship, and food.

LENTEN FOOD COLLECTION: Our Mission Team will be collecting food in March to benefit The Food Bank of Dayton and the FISH Food Pantry, and to share in an all-church Lenten practice of giving! This is a great chance to take an action-oriented approach to Lent. All non-perishable foods will be accepted. Look for weekly prompts in the church bulletin during Lent for full details.

When Is the Collection? We will be accepting weekly Lenten donations March 3rd, March 10th, March 17th, and March 24th. We also collect nonperishables year-round, so it's always a great time to give!

Nonperishable Food Suggestions: Feel free to get the whole family involved in selecting items to bring in! Although any nonperishable food is needed and will be used, here are some suggestions of items your family might bring:

Basic Foods: Hearty soups, stews (beef, chicken, and dumplings), chili, peanut butter and jelly, macaroni and cheese

Meats/High Protein: Canned meats (ham, chicken, meat spreads), canned fish like tuna, salmon, sardines or other fish, nuts and seeds, rice, and beans

Dairy Group: Evaporated milk, powdered milk, puddings, and custards

Fruits and Veggies: Canned fruits, canned juices, canned vegetables

Breads Cereals, and Pasta: Hot and cold breakfasts like oatmeal or cream of wheat, baking mixes (pancake, corn bread, cake mix, icing, quick breads), pasta, canned sauces

YOUR SUPPORT of the Giving Trees activity provided: support for 6 clients of Artemis Center, including 15 children contributions from over 45 members of the FPC community about \$2200 worth of winter clothing, blankets, pots & pans, and toys about 140 lbs. of cleaning products, plus grocery gift cards (from the directed mission portion of the annual budget, through your pledges and offerings). -Artemis Center
