Late night thoughts on baseball and the moral reconstruction of reality . . .

At his 2005 induction into the Baseball Hall of Fame, former Chicago Cub Ryne Sandberg, who died this week, gestured to the Hall of Fame inductees seated around him and said, "These guys sitting up here did not pave the way for the rest of us so that players could swing for the fences every time up and forget how to move a runner over to third. It's disrespectful to them, to you, and to the game of baseball we all played growing up." He continued: "I didn't play the game right because I saw a reward at the end of the tunnel. I played it right because that's what you're supposed to do—play it right and with respect."

I applaud Mr. Sandberg's eloquent testimony to his moral center. There is a moral foundation for human life that exists beyond us, our choices, and our wants. Right and wrong exist apart from us and apart from "winning" or "losing." There is a purpose and meaning for human life and the pursuit of that meaning and purpose is what gives human life value and direction. We seek to do what is right not because it offers us some reward, nor because it is simply a matter of personal preference, but rather because we are striving to participate in the source of all meaning. For Christians we summarily call that source God and human life is simply the opportunity to conform ourselves, however provisionally, to God's pattern, direction, and purpose.

Unfortunately, that foundation of morality in something beyond ourselves started unravelling a few centuries ago. Nowadays, people rarely ask how their choices conform to the character of God or even how those choices correspond to the ultimate purpose or goal of our lives. If you ask somebody how they choose what they choose you are likely to be told that it simply "felt right." The problem is that disagreements over subjective feelings cannot be resolved by rational means. We no longer engage in moral arguments because there is no longer any moral framework to argue over. Instead, we simply try to impose agreement or compliance on others. This is why our politics have become both more vicious and meaningless. This is also why our society in general and younger generations in particular are stalked by nihilism and despair. Devoid of meaning, purpose, and value, we become less than human.

The church, at its best, is both a repository of and a school for virtue, the habituated practice of striving after ultimate meaning. We believe that in one Jesus of Nazareth, humanity has received a model, a prototype, for what human beings are meant to be and do. To the extent we emulate that model, we are living into our ultimate meaning and purpose. To the extent we do not, we progressively become something less than human. Unfortunately, this life guiding lesson tends to get drowned out by the infantile public demand for choice free of all external constraints. Authenticity and pleasure have replaced truth, goodness, and justice.

Our world is hungry for meaning and starving for the lack of it. But somewhere along the way our society forgot how to morally nourish our lives and world. The church's vocation is to first show and then share that better way just like Mr. Sandberg. The church needs to preach what it practices. Goodness is the foundation for authentic humanness. The stakes are high, the time is short, and the task is audacious. Thankfully we do not do it alone.
