#### THOUGHTS FROM BRIAN

Poetry contains a higher density of information than prose because it speaks simultaneously to the heart and the mind. We always know more than we can tell, and poetry is the subtle art that through allusion, image, metaphor, and meter conveys far more than our flat and tired indicative. When the words fail, we do not need more explanation. We do not need argument. We do not need description. We need poetry to give voice to the spirit.

The Book of Psalms is the supreme book of poetry in the Old Testament (*sorry Job*). Its sweeping verse lifts the whole range of human emotion and experience from the deepest despair to shame and wrath through hope that reaches beyond itself to exultation. Facing the deepest moments of despair and hope, Jesus himself turns to those words he would have recited since childhood like Psalm 22. The Psalms collectively provide Israel's vocabulary of lament, celebration, and thanksgiving. And they can do the same for us.

Sometimes it is hard to know how to pray. No one ever said prayer needed to be original. When in doubt, pray the Psalms. If it was good enough for Jesus, it is certainly good enough for us. Beyond our prayers, we rarely preach on the psalms now. They are a bit too ephemeral, lacking all narrative except those we bring to them. Instead, each is like a window into human experience in and through God. Throughout October, we will be preaching on the Psalms. This is rather unfamiliar territory for the preachers as well as the congregation. In other words, the Psalms may be the perfect texts for our shared moment with its ambiguity and uncertainty.

With what words do we worship God in a strange and unfamiliar place amid the anxieties of the nations? The Psalms provide an answer if we care to listen.

I celebrate these cooler early autumn days and the invitation they bring to spend more time outside in nature walking, hiking, or just sitting on the back deck. As the number of COVID-19 cases continue to rise so our anxiety continues to rise. Stepping outside into the company of trees, and sky, and autumn breezes is one way to keep our anxiety at bay.

I invite you, church family, to join me this year in *quarterly hikes* as we celebrate each season of the year. These hikes will be for families, beginner hikers, and those who want to hike at a faster pace, too. The **first mile** of each hike will be at a slower pace for families with children and for beginner hikers. Those who wish to hike a more vigorous hike can join us for the first mile and then continue on with me for two more miles at a faster pace.

I will be leading our first Fairmont Hike on Saturday, October 16<sup>th</sup> (rain date will be October 23<sup>rd</sup>) at Bill Yeck Park at the Smith House Entrance. We will meet at **10:45 a.m.** for an 11:00 a.m. start time. Bill Yeck Park has nice picnic areas for families who want to have a picnic lunch following the hike.

#### SPECIAL FOOD PANTRY DRIVE SUNDAY

On Reformation Sunday, October 31s, we invite you to bring to a special food pantry donation to either the 8:30 a.m. or 10:30 a.m. worship services. Baskets for the canned food, non-perishable food, or personal care items will be at each door of the Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary.

Southeast Food Pantry/FISH is a multi-denominational volunteer food pantry based out of the Southminster Presbyterian Church. They are one of the member food pantries working with the Dayton FoodBank to provide emergency food assistance to those in need. In 2021 they are on pace to serve over 12,000 meals!

Volunteer opportunities—They are in need of 2-4 callers and 2-4 deliverers to fill time slots per month. Callers set up deliverers with clients on Monday or Wednesday mornings. Deliverers coordinate the delivery of food that afternoon. 1-2 hour commitment each time. Food Donations—They are in need of nonperishable food and personal care items. Fairmonters have been generously donating these items for some time and they are delivered to the food pantry weekly or monthly. Some examples of items needed are as follows:
