The Great Story continues. Over the past year we have been exploring part one of the Great Story of God and God's people the life and experience of a peculiar people called Israel through whom God sought to reconcile the world. It worked out, but not the way anyone let alone the Israelites planned. Starting in November and then proceeding through all of 2023 we will be continuing that journey of redemption through the second part of the Great Story in which the relationship between God and Israel reaches its climax and fulfillment in Jesus of Nazareth.

Over the next year, we will be exploring the major themes of Jesus' life, work, and teachings through the particular lens of the Gospel of Matthew. We will be proceeding through the Gospel recounting all the major events of Jesus life in a sustained focus on one Gospel so that we can share in at least one early Christian community's understand of who Jesus was and why he was and is important. Matthew, of all the Gospels, is most concerned to share and show how Jesus comes in fulfillment of the prophetic expectations of the Hebrew Bible. Jesus, as portrayed in Matthew, is very much a Jewish messiah but no longer only for Jews but for the whole world. For Matthew, Jesus is the Son of Man and the Son of David and the suffering servant by whose wounds we are healed.

Matthew is also distinct in his earthy and ethical particularity. Matthew contains the great ethical discourse of the New Testament—The Sermon on the Mount—that we will be examining throughout Lent. Matthew along with Luke gives us the Lord's Prayer. And Matthew provides more detailed foundations for the establishment and function of the church. In the early church, Matthew was quoted more often than any other Gospel and was therefore placed first in the order of the canon.

Advent and Christmas according to Matthew are representative of the entire book. Matthew's nativity is as much a critique of human society as it is an expression of hope in God's. Matthew alone among the Gospels focuses on Joseph and his own anxieties as he tries to reconcile loving kindness with legal and social propriety and obligations. Matthew describes wandering Persian astrologers showing up Jerusalem looking for the infant king with a sense of foreboding and the foreshadowing of death. And Matthew alone relates the real terrors of what happened in Bethlehem after Jesus was born as the holy family fled across the desert to Egypt. Matthew's nativity story is unconcerned with our holiday sentiments. Instead Matthew is intimately concerned that we each come to know and understand exactly what sort of King this Jesus is and the full extent of reign and claim upon each of our lives.

Happy Advent and Merry Christmas. We do not look for the coming of the Christ child in Bethlehem. We instead scan the horizon of our age for the signs of the return of our King.

January 2024 Connections: The World of the New Testament

Throughout 2024, starting on January 18 on Wednesday nights at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom, we will be exploring the life and ministry of Jesus of Nazareth through the lens of the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus lived during a particular time and at a particular place and that time and that context decisively shaped both his message and how it was recorded in the Gospels. Throughout the winter and spring of 2023, we will be examining the context of the first century A.D. in Palestine and beyond so we can better understand Jesus' message and meanings. If you wish to go deeper, you are invited to follow along with two companion books: *The World of the New Testament* by Joel Green and Lee Martin McDonald (Baker Publishing, 2013) and *The New Testament and Its World* by N.T. Wright and Michael Bird (SPCK/Zondervan, 2019) available online and at bookshops.

What is Per Capita and why is it \$53.10? The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. That means that we share in mutual ministry and accountability with and for each other. One of the ways we do that is by sharing in the cost of the denomination. This is done through individual assessments based on the number of members in each church. These assessments, called "per capita," are mandatory and are used to support the work of the General Assembly and the Synod. Those funds are obtained either from our general Fairmont revenues or from special offerings of individuals who wish to pay their share individually. The total per member assessment for 2023 is \$53.10. That is the cost of being a member of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) denomination as opposed to the local congregation. If you would like to directly pay your share of our commitment to the greater church, the amount per member is \$53.10.

FREE MONEY: Taxpayers over 72 years of age with an IRA or a 401K/403B accounts may transfer withdrawals (up to \$100,000 per year) directly to Fairmont Presbyterian Church or other "qualified charitable organizations" and not pay tax on the distribution. Retirement savings accounts of various sorts (e.g., IRA's and 401k's) require individuals over 72 to annually make required minimum distributions or face significant tax penalties. Those distributions are then added to your taxable income, often boosting your tax bracket. But, if you direct those distributions in whole or in part to Fairmont or other charities, those funds do not count as taxable income at all regardless of whether you itemize your taxes or not. This transfer method can save you significant tax dollars. As always, consult with qualified advisors to help with tax planning, but using qualified charitable distributions may be an efficient way for you to support Fairmont!

Kettering Backpack Program provides nearly 600 children enrolled in Kettering City Schools with nutritious food for weekends throughout the school year. The food bank provides the infrastructure for more than 100-member food pantries, community kitchens, and shelters that serve as the charitable hunger relief network in Greene, Montgomery, and Preble Counties, including the South Dayton Food Pantry/ FISH, which serves Fairmont's immediate area.
