Thoughts from Brian

So, how is Fairmont doing? It is a question I hear quite often. My best answer is Fairmont is doing well, but different. Once upon a time, congregations measured their health in numbers of members. But nowadays many people who are otherwise quite active in the life and ministries of the church do not want to formally join. Membership on the books is no longer a telling measure. Once upon a time we could look to attendance in worship as another indicator of health. Measured solely by in-person attendance, we would be in trouble as it is down about 30% over pre covid numbers. Nowadays we measure both in person and our best estimate of online attendance and that combined estimate is about 30% above pre-covid numbers. Finally, congregational giving has increased slightly this year.

Numbers by themselves are not all that important, but they offer evidence of what is really going on. What I suspect is happening is that Fairmont is changing. People value more and different ways of connecting with Christ's work in the congregation, whether it be through in-person attendance or online, classes in-person or online, and our weekly written offerings to members of all ages. Over the past 18 months we have redesigned many of our ministries to make them more easily accessible to more people. And while that may mean fewer people in the building it has succeeded in reaching more people in the world. While some people initially worried that all these changes could hurt Fairmont, we are not shrinking. Actually, we are growing, just not in the ways we traditionally measured growth.

So, what comes next? We do not know what will happen next. We do not know how the pandemic may evolve. If you want definitive answers, I do not have any. But this much I know. God is with us in everything we do, blessing and encouraging us to step into a future that God has already prepared for us. And I know that we have gotten pretty good at walking forward together in the dark. So, we will continue moving forward reinventing ourselves along the way guided by our traditions and values but expressing them in new ways with new technology. Together, we are feeling our way through the uncertain present into God's certain future. Thank you for being a part of the journey.

Feeding Our Community-2021

In 2020, Fairmont members donated close to \$16,000 for local food relief. Thank you for your generous giving! There is still a great need to feed families, children and youth in our community. We are still seeking financial donations for **The Kettering Backpack and The Dayton Foodbank/ FISH** as well as donations of nonperishable food or personal Items to **South Dayton Food pantry/ FISH**

Kettering Backpack Program

This organization provides nearly 600 needy children enrolled in Kettering City Schools with nutritious food to consume every weekend throughout the school year. The students are identified by school counselors and are discretely provided a sack of nutritious food that includes milk, fruit, ravioli, pudding, juice, vegetables, apple sauce, macaron, and peanut butter. Due to COVID-19 the number of hungry students has risen, causing the program's food costs to increase greatly. Financial donations may be made either through Fairmont's website or online at ketteringbackpack.org.

Dayton Food Bank (South Dayton Foodbank/FISH)

The Dayton Food Bank has served as the primary source of food for the hunger relief network in the Miami Valley. This food bank - the only one of its kind in the area - relieves hunger in the community through a network of partner agencies by acquiring and distributing food. The food bank provides the infrastructure for more than 100 member food pantries, community kitchens, and shelters that serve as the charitable hunger relief network in Montgomery, Greene, and Preble Counties, including the South Dayton Food Pantry/FISH which serves Fairmont's Immediate area. Donations to the Food Bank may be made either through Fairmont's website or online at thefoodbank-dayton.org.

South Dayton Food Pantry/FISH

This organization is one of the member food pantries working with the Dayton Food Bank. They are in need of nonperishable food and personal care items. Fairmonters have been generously donating these items for some time and they are delivered to the food pantry weekly or monthly. Some examples of items needed are as follows:

Food—canned goods, mac and cheese and pasta.

Personal care items—bath soap, detergent, tooth paste, tooth brushes

Please deposit your donated food or personal care items in one of two barrels, located outside the elevator and in the cloakroom outside the church office. Please be sure that "use by" or "sell by" dates have not expired or the items will not be usable.
