#### THOUGHTS FROM BRIAN

As Reformed Christians we believe that God has one continuous saving plan for healing creation and everyone within it. That plan unfolds across history and is recounted in both collections we call the Old and New Testaments. Each can only be understood in conversation with the other. Taken together, they present a cosmic and historic account of God's redeeming work from the first creation to the end of time, beginning and ending in a garden.

Throughout 2022 we will be examining the major themes of the Old Testament and how they form the foundation of our faith and understanding of who God is and who we are. Primary among these themes we will be examining relationship, covenant, justice, liberation, law, identity, community, and the character of God. Our hope is that in doing so, we may start making connections across centuries and books of the Bible, engaging prophets, priests and kings in the great story which is also our story.

We will not be doing this alone. We will be sharing with the Hilliard United Methodist Church in Hilliard, Ohio. For the past six years, Rev. April Blaine of Hilliard UMC and I have shared together in a spirituality group formed when we were both students of Richard Rohr, Cynthia Bourgeault, and James Finley at The Living School in Albuquerque. Over the course of the year, we will be sharing our adult education offerings, Bible studies, occasional spiritual reflections like Besides Still Waters, and later we hope to swap pulpits on occasion. I encourage you to join our 7:00 p.m. Thursday nights Zoom Bible study and meet some of the curious, interesting, and very friendly folks from Hilliard.

We believe in a God made known through story and human lives. That means that the stories of each of our lives are a part of God's story and vice versa. Please join us as we explore the great story and discover who we are and who God is for us.

# Helping Hands, Helping Hearts



The Mission Team looks forward to continuing in 2022 some of the projects we conducted in 2021 and undertaking new projects as well. Here are some of our activities in 2021:

Jeremiah's Letter—This Christmas, we delivered Walmart and Kroger gift cards totaling \$3,600 to nine area families that were identified as being in need by the Jeremiah's Letter Organization. They were so appreciative it warmed our hearts.

Mittens, Gloves and Hats for JFK—Fairmont very generously donated dozens of mittens, gloves and hats to needy children at JFK Elementary School in Kettering.

The tree in the Narthex was covered and the basket on the Mission Table was overflowing!

Dayton Food Bank/South Dayton Food Pantry (FISH)—Fairmont members Donated over \$8,000 to the Dayton Food Bank for local food relief in 2021. In addition, Fairmonters have donated nonperishable food and personal care items on a continuing basis to the South Dayton Food Pantry/FISH including a major collection during our 5th Sunday drive in October.

**SICSA**—Our 5th Sunday Project for May was to hold a collection for SICSA, asking for funds as well as Tidy Cat litter, wet kitten food, etc. The congregation responded generously to this drive and SICSA personnel appreciated our donations.

In 2022, we will continue our association with the agencies and organizations shown in our annual report, included in Fairmont's Annual Meeting of the Congregation on February 6, 20220. These organizations can also be seen on the bulletin board at the Mission Table in the upstairs hallway at church.

#### Words from Cody

I think grace is a tricky word. I've read about it, experienced it, and heard the testimonials. It is a deep transforming kindness that is given often when I least deserve it. There's always this tension between the way I think it should look and the way it actually comes to me. Kathleen Norris said, "grace is not gentle or made-to-order. It often comes disguised as loss, or failure, or unwelcome change." Whether it be through a passage from scripture or observations in everyday life, I seek to see the beauty in this leaky apparatus called life.

Often I show people on a journey. Sometimes my subjects' hands are open, offering something of themselves to the world. This is what keeps me coming back to the studio, capturing these small acts of kindness that quietly begin to illuminate everything.

I work with cut paper and paint because I enjoy the interplay of the known and unknown. For the known, I work out many variations of a sketch until the design I'm looking for is finally realized. The unknown comes from my files full of patterns and objects waiting to find a new home. I am repeatedly fascinated when I find that some odd cut-out works better than my original intention.

#### BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP

### What is Per Capita and why is it \$52.23?

The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. That means that we share in mutual ministry and accountability with and for each other. One of the ways we do that is by sharing in the cost of the denomination. This is done through individual assessments based on the number of members in each church. These assessments, called "per capita," are mandatory and are used to support the work of the General Assembly and the Synod. Those funds are obtained either from our general Fairmont revenues or from special offerings of individuals who wish to pay their share individually. The total per member assessment for 2022 is \$52.23. That is the cost of being a member of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) denomination as opposed to the local congregation. If you would like to directly pay your share of our commitment to the greater church, the amount per member is \$52.23.

#### Free Money:

Taxpayers over 70 1/2 years of age with an IRA or a 401K/403B accounts may transfer withdrawals (up to \$100,000 per year) directly to Fairmont Presbyterian Church or other "qualified charitable organizations" and not pay tax on the distribution. Retirement savings accounts of various sorts require individuals over 72 to annually make required minimum distributions or face significant tax penalties. Those distributions are then added to your taxable income, often boosting your tax bracket. But, if you direct those distributions in whole or in part to Fairmont or other charities, those funds do not count as taxable income. This transfer method can save you significant tax dollars. As always, consult with qualified advisors to help with tax planning, but using qualified charitable distributions may be a tax efficient way for you to support Fairmont! All such qualified.
