In 1844, a small group of Christian reformers banded together in the newly industrializing city of London to create a fellowship that would provide and put Christian values into practice by developing a healthy body, mind, and spirit for people in the anonymous and often lonely city. Together they formed the Young Men's Christian Association which has since become a worldwide movement seeking to help men and women through personal development, education, skill formation, and faith formation all guided by the Gospel. Today the YMCA is the premier nongovernmental organization focused on the development of the health, character, and wellness of young people.

While you may be familiar with the YMCA's community centers, sports programs, and summer camps, you may not be aware that the Kettering City Schools have partnered with the YMCA to provide high quality early childhood education and before and after school care for children in our community. This partnership will elevate Fairmont's prominence as a good neighbor active in our community. And finally, the YMCA will help us financially in sharing the costs for our ministry.


