THOUGHTS FROM BRIAN

"Advent is a season of waiting." That sentence begins most Advent articles ever written in church newsletters and while it is true, it takes on added meeting and weight this year. We are a people in waiting for a vaccine and an end to contagion, sickness, isolation, and fear. We really do dwell in land of deep darkness stalked by depression and uncertainty. We do not need to imagine the burdened waiting of Advent this year; we are living it.

Waiting is hard because it forces us to face our limits. No amount of will, money, or power, let alone impatience, will speed up the distribution of the vaccine. We simply wait, watch, hope, and carry on. Without the ability to force events to happen on our terms and timetable, it is easy to become cynical or despair. We are not the first people to face such a challenge.

Advent often focuses on the people directly associated with the birth of Jesus beginning with the annunciation—Mary, Joseph, Elizabeth and all the rest. But this year I am intrigued by the people who came before them. Generations held onto hope and passed it down to their children without ever beholding its fulfillment in Nazareth and Bethlehem. From the prophets down through the centuries, father would tell daughter, mother would tell son, that this world and all its troubles and tyrannies would be made right. They stubbornly held onto the prophecy that God would not stand apart, but at the right time would enter the story as one of us. While Matthew and Luke list Jesus' genealogy, after King David, they are mere names to us, lives and stories lost in time. We know nothing about them, except they tenaciously clung on to hope.

We are a people of Advent, a people of waiting, not like Mary and Joseph, but like those many generations who bridged the revealing of hope and its fulfillment. Without angels, magi, or much fanfare, they simply got on with the daily business of following God's intentions and sharing God's hope. Most of our lives are not defined by spectacular epiphanies, but rather the simple task of daily faithfulness. And when we do it together, it is more than enough to kindle the flame of hope and love. We shall wait for the Messiah. Yes, we shall wait for the Messiah. Even though he may tarry, we shall wait for the Messiah. This we believe.

"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel"

One of the oldest of our Advent hymns, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," finds its origins in an ancient Latin hymn called the "O Antiphons." The original Advent calendar was an ancient Latin hymn called the "O Antiphons." Starting on December 17th and continuing through the day before Christmas Eve, this series of seven messianic titles was sung at evening prayer to mark the week leading up to the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord. In order, the antiphons are:

O Sapientia Wisdom O Adonai Lord

O Radix Jesse Root of Jesse O Clavis David Key of David

O Oriens Sunrise

O Rex Gentium King of the Nations

O Emmanuel God with Us

If you read the first letter (not counting the O) of each antiphon from bottom to top, the group of antiphons forms a backwards acrostic poem in Latin: *ero cras.* or "tomorrow I will come."

Advent waiting is a deep waiting that spans the universe. It is not just a one-time birth of a child but a life altering birth which will bring salvation and hope to everyone.

God is with us. Emmanuel.

ADVENT

Please join us in worship during the Advent Season as we prepare for the birth of Christ. Advent begins November 29th. Advent is the season of hope, love, joy, and peace as we await the arrival of Christ. We use candles to represent a time of light, because Jesus is the light of the world. He is the Christ Candle on the Advent Wreath, which is the fifth candle on the Advent Wreath and the last candle to be lit. A wreath is used to symbolize a circle, which is God's eternity and unending love.

You can very easily make your own Advent Wreath that you can light at home during our Worship Services each Sunday of Advent and on Christmas Eve. You can find many directions on the Internet on how to make an Advent Wreath.

CHRISMON ORNAMENTS

The ornaments that decorate the Christmas Tree in the Sanctuary are called Chrismon Ornaments. They were first developed in 1957 by Frances Spencer of Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia. She wanted appropriate religious decorations for the Christmas Tree in her church. The name "Chrismons" is a blending of Christ and monogram to represent symbols of Christ. Chrismons are always gold and white to symbolize majesty and purity. Chrismons are now used in many churches across the United States.

In 1960, members of Fairmont made Chrismons to decorate the tree in our Sanctuary. Some commonly used ornaments are: bells, crosses, crowns, cups, fish, doves, stars, lambs, and mangers. They are always white and gold.

If you would like to make some Chrismon Ornaments for your Christmas Tree at home, you can find many directions and patterns on the Internet.

What is Per Capita and why is it \$52.23? The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. That means that we share in mutual ministry and accountability with and for each other. One of the ways we do that is by sharing in the cost of the denomination. This is done through individual assessments based on the number of members in each church. These assessments, called "per capita," are mandatory and are used to support the work of the General Assembly and the Synod. Those funds are obtained either from our general Fairmont revenues or from special offerings of individuals who wish to pay their share individually. The total per member assessment for 2021 is \$52.23. That is the cost of being a member of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) denomination as opposed to the local congregation. If you would like to directly pay your share of our commitment to the greater church, the amount per member is \$52.23.
