What is a faithful response to a world going crazy? That is the question that confronted the prophet Jeremiah some 27 centuries ago. God seemed decidedly absent. Familiar institutions were teetering. Leadership was utterly absent. The nations were locked in conflict. And the culture of ancient Judah was changing almost daily. Jeremiah knew what to do amid a society on the verge of collapse. Jeremiah bought real estate.

Radical hope in the power of God to recreate out of the ruins or out of nothing at all is expressed in our prayers, our scripture, and also in our concrete economic decisions. Jeremiah observes all the legal requirements to duly record a clean title to the property even when everyone around him is selling because of pervasive anxiety for the future. Jeremiah knows what everyone else around him forgets. Beyond all our anxious ponderings, beyond every chance and circumstance that history can hurl at us, beyond success and failure and even life and death, God is at work in the past, present, and future working to redeem, restore, and transform all life, and your life. Humans always tend to worry about what will happen. God will happen. And that means the only safe bet in life or death is to invest in what this God is doing.

On Sunday November 13 we will be collecting and giving thanks for your pledges of financial support for the ministry of Fairmont in the year ahead. Everything we do together, we do because of your prayers, your love, your labor, and your giving. Pledging is a defiant act of courage that flies in the face of the selfish cynicism of our age. Pledging is both a concrete expression of our faith that God is at work in our world and an expression of our desire to be a part of that work. We were created for this work, participating through the Spirit in transforming lives. And we call that collective effort church.

The world may seem unsettled right now, but I know how you can ground your life in an unshakeable foundation. Participate with God in God's work today. Invest in God's work. Go all in. It will change your life and lead you to a better one.
