Lent, properly understood, is less a season and more a practice: practicing the presence of God. Protestants in general and modern people in particular tend to reduce spirituality and religion to information—data about God and Jesus. Information about God and Jesus is important, but since we are very finite creatures speaking of infinite and eternal subjects, our information is at best highly incomplete and at worst altogether wrong.

The thing we get most wrong is that we treat the triune God as an object, a thing that is "out there" to which we ascribe attributes and about which we presume to deduce intentions and future actions. But if God is God, then God is no object at all. If God is God, then there is no valid sentence that can ever be uttered beginning with the words "God is . . ." because God is necessarily and always so beyond any attribute we might utter. The real art of prayer is unlearning how we normally think in our dualistic mental habits of subject and object. Despite how things may appear inside our own self-obsessed heads, we the "I" of our lives are never the subject. Only God is subject and we and everything else in all creation are objects.

Because God is not out there, God is already in here, already in the depths of our consciousness and being. That is the presence of God within and between us that Paul calls Spirit. If you are a creature within creation (and you are) then God is already fully and completely accessible to you, within you. This communion is not a task to be achieved, but simply a state of being to be uncovered that is already latent within you. You and I are the branches and God is the living vine curling its way through every moment and every breath from the depths of our being. We of course do not like to go there. We prefer the distractions of our egos, anxieties, and the endless internal and external chattering of our minds and social media. We erect cacophonous barriers of ceaseless banal thought and often foolishly call that monologue our life. But our real lives are not our thoughts. Our real lives lie somewhere else entirely.

There is a way around it all, back to the source and foundation of our being. You can let go. Jesus did, most dramatically through the cross. Letting go of all the distractions so you can pay attention to the one true thing is the key. The purity of the human heart is to will one thing. *James 4:8*. To let go of all the distractions, all the idols internal and external (*the most insidious idols are the ones inside our heads*) and with a simple intention to seek God with all our attention is the essence of all Christian spiritual practice. All it takes is a little intention, a little attention, and a lot of patient practice. But it works. It always works because God is always there just waiting for you. God is not actually hidden. We are distracted.

May you have a holy and blessed Lent, now and always. And may you experience moments of resurrection life on this side of the grave.

Winter Spotlight: Brigid's Path

This winter we had a Minute for Mission on the nonprofit organization Brigid's Path, one of the several organizations included in our Mission Team's annual budget. Their primary goal is to care for infants born exposed to addictive substances like opioids or prescription medication. This organization is the first facility in Ohio to offer in-patient treatment in a facility designed to feel like home. Brigid's Path has offered 24/7 care from skilled medical staff and volunteers to 213 babies since December 2017. They also partner with other community resources to support moms, encouraging mothers to room with, care for, and bond with their babies as much as possible to provide them with the long-term stability their child will need. March Lenten Food Collection

For the March Sundays in Lent, our Mission Team is hosting a non-perishable food collection to benefit The Food Bank of Dayton and the FISH Food Pantry! This is a great chance to take an action-oriented approach to Lent. All non-perishable foods will be accepted. We invite you to participate as a Lenten practice of giving. Feel free to get the whole family involved in selecting items to bring in!

When Is the Collection? We'll be accepting donations March 3rd, March 10th, March 17th, and March 24th.

Nonperishable Food Suggestions: Although any nonperishable food is needed and will be used, here are some suggestions of items your family might bring:

Basic Foods: Hearty soups, stews (beef, chicken and dumplings), chili, peanut butter and jelly, macaroni and cheese

Meats/High Protein: Canned meats (ham, chick en, meat spreads), canned fish like tuna, salmon, sardines or other fish, nuts and seeds, rice and beans

Dairy Group: Evaporated milk, powdered milk, puddings, and custards

Fruits and Veggies: Canned fruits, canned juices, canned vegetables

Breads Cereals, and Pasta: Hot and cold breakfasts like oatmeal or cream of wheat, baking mixes (pancake, corn bread, cake mix, icing, quick breads), pasta, canned sauces.
