The world has changed. Fairmont was founded in 1945 as a large flourishing congregation riding the postwar boom of culturally ascendant Christendom. Tailor made to meet those conditions, Fairmont flourished. But now those cultural and social conditions have changed. Religious participation is no longer assumed or sometimes even welcomed. Secularism, individualism, withdrawal from public life, along with at least seventeen other factors have all transformed our social and cultural environment. The world has changed and the question is, will we?

Fairmont's leadership have been studying, learning about, pondering, praying, and dreaming about these changes and the challenges and opportunities they present. We would now like to invite you into that conversation. I will be leading a workshop on Adaptive Change at Fairmont on **Saturday, October 18 at 9:00 a.m.** in the Fellowship Hall. We will be looking at the *process* by which some congregations learn, adapt, and change while others do not. We will be considering particular models and methods of change. And we will take careful notice of how our anxiety, grief, and desire for quick and easy answers can get us into trouble. Short cuts are rarely short. We will be considering *how* change happens, not *what* must change because the *what* question takes both more time and a lot more prayer and people.

I do not have quick or simple answers. There is no "expert" who can offer the solution because the conditions we find ourselves in are genuinely new. Instead, I have a guiding metaphor. Once upon a time, Israel thought they had built God's Kingdom on Earth. Then that all came crashing down courtesy of Babylon. They adapted to new homes in a new land with new people. They held onto their core beliefs, and actually began holding onto God even tighter. But they changed. That change is marked by their changing name from Israel into the Yehudi (people of Judah), which later shortened to the Jews. Despite the changes, God doubled down on God's people precisely because they were faithful in exile. It was the exile that expanded Judaism's ethical horizon of salvation beyond themselves to embrace God's project for all people.

In the heady days of 1945, the depression was decisively over, Fascism had been decisively defeated, everything seemed possible. The church in America latched onto its heroic vision of building the Kingdom of God on Earth, here and now. It did not quite work out according to plan. The world changed. But there is another beautiful vision for the flourishing of God's people. We can become gardens in the desert, oasis in the wilderness, refuges for the lost and the hungry looking for a way back home. We may not be socially dominant, but God's people have always done their best work at the margins (think of Moses, Ruth, or Paul). And we can do so again.

The world has changed and that means Christ is sending us to new and different work. The only question is whether we will follow into that bright future.

PIPE ORGAN

What to do about the Pipe Organ?

Fairmont's Pipe Organ turned sixty years old this summer and we celebrate how it has supported our worship for many decades. Like some of us at that age, it needs a little work. Pipe organs are incredibly complex mechanisms. Hundreds of switches, valves, and baffles need to be cleaned, checked, and if necessary repaired or replaced. Pipes need to be cleaned and tuned. This sort of once-in-a-lifetime refurbishment is a normal part of caring for church pipe organs. The question before us is what should we do about the Pipe Organ? A small group has been appointed by Trustees and Session to consider this question and they would like to hear from you.

Please join us between the worship services on Sunday October 12th or after the second service on Sunday October 19th in the Fellowship Hall to hear more about what is possible, but more importantly to share your perspective. Thank you for joining us.

FALL STEWARDSHIP

In a family visit to Columbus this weekend, it was readily apparent on the drive over and back that our bountiful Ohio corn and soybean fields have reached the fall season. Add in a few pumpkins and the beginning of leaves starting to turn colors, it becomes apparent that harvest time is here.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and Artemis Center is celebrating its 40^{th} anniversary of operations! As such, they provided a report on their services:

Last Christmas, their Building Hope Holiday program helped over **54** families and **224** children!

Our Fairmont Christmas Giving Trees helped **6** of those families, with **17** children served and **55** of our members contributing gifts!\

In 2024, Artemis assisted **514** individuals in providing resources, like transportation, relocation assistance, and home safety equipment (door locks, alarms, etc.)

In 2024, **815** individuals including families received food and hygiene products from Artemis' various supply pantries


FAIRMONT MEN'S GROUP
