Everything we thought about the way things are is wrong.

Instead of proclaiming, "He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!" on Easter morning, what if we made the far more personal and uncomfortable confession that we were wrong? Most of us are tainted by the grief, anxiety, and shame that pervade our world right now. Grief is unhealed pain of something that went wrong. Anxiety is the abstract fear that something will go wrong. And shame is the nagging feeling that I am wrong. They weigh us down. Over time they corrupt us. Grief, anxiety, and shame if left unprocessed lead to every human vice and cruelty. Evil creeps into our lives through their invitation. Pilate was not necessarily a particularly cruel man, but he was anxious and his anxiety led him to do terrible things. Judas was not born a betrayer but became one as he unsuccessfully wrestled with his grief over his misguided projections of what a messiah was supposed to be. And Peter was not a coward but was cowed into desertion by the weight of his own shame. All these corruptions begin with an assumption of fear, fear that we are not safe, not loved, not valued, and that the universe really does not care.

But Easter says, everything we thought about the way things are is wrong.

Beneath all the lilies and lace, just underneath all the triumphant hymns, lies the simple fact of Easter that undermines all our other presumed facts. A dead man would not stay dead. And if you cannot rely on the dependability of death anymore then everything else is now up for grabs. Easter is not merely the demonstration that death no longer works anymore. Far more unsettling is that perfected life emerges from it, life made complete, whole, healed, and transformed. Life comes out of death. Consequently, all those things we thought would hurt us turn out to be powerless. All our deepest fears were founded on lies.

Resurrection is many things, but most of all it is an eruption of our future in our past. An empty tomb just outside the walls of Jerusalem opened a small window for just a moment through our space time into our future where we could observe for the first time what is real. And what is real is very different from the way we presume things to be.

We do not need to be afraid anymore. It is okay now to leave our tombs.

#### Maundy Thursday Worship 7:00 p.m. April 14

Join us for worship as we enter the central drama and mystery of the Christian faith remembering and celebrating together both what Jesus did for us and what he instructed us to do. "Maundy" is short for *mandatum*, Latin for "command." On this night we will share in the Lord's Supper just as Jesus commanded as recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke and consider how Jesus both fulfills and expands the Old Testament lessons of Passover.

This year we will also honor Jesus' commandment recorded in the Gospel of John where he washed his disciples' feet and told them, "If I, your Lord and teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." (John 13:14-15). If you wish to participate in the rite of foot washing (*or hand washing, you are invited but there is no obligation*) please wear appropriate footwear that is easy to slip on and off. You will have the opportunity to both wash and be washed as a sign of mutual service and love.

#### SESSION REPORT

#### Fairmont Preschool News

Our Fairmont Preschool has been in operation since 1957. Founded by its first director, Louise Patterson, Fairmont Preschool has provided a loving, Christian, "first school" experience for Fairmont Presbyterian Church families as well as families in our surrounding neighborhoods. It has been a source of Outreach to our community, often resulting in new church members.

Through the past 65 years, Fairmont Presbyterian Church has provided a clean, safe, warm and inviting facility with electricity, heat, and pastoral and office support. The yearly preschool income generated solely by student tuition, covers costs for supplies, equipment, enrichments, refreshments, licensing and teacher salaries.

In the last few years, Fairmont Preschool has experienced growing shortfalls in the budget. There are a number of factors contributing to the deficit. Declining enrollment seems to be the major concern. Our Christian Formation Team recommended the Session approve covering the preschool budget shortfalls with the hope that enrollment would improve in the fall. Sadly, the struggle to make ends meet continues.

Single-parent families and two-parent working families needing extended-day child care and competing public school programs are some of the many issues that need to be addressed in order to offer a quality, viable preschool program. To do this effectively, the Session has voted to suspend operation of Fairmont Preschool at the end of the school year in May 2022, with the intention to reopen for the 2023-2024 school year. This time will allow a committee to investigate, thoroughly, options to continue our operation of a preschool that meets the needs of Fairmont Presbyterian Church as well as our community

God bless you all for your continued support of Fairmont Preschool.

#### Feeding Our Community—2022

We are still seeking financial donations for **The Kettering Backpack and The Dayton Foodbank/FISH.** 

#### Kettering Backpack Program

This organization provides nearly 600 needy children enrolled in Kettering City Schools with nutritious food to consume every weekend throughout the school year. The students are identified by school counselors and are discretely provided a sack of nutritious food that includes milk, fruit, pudding, juice, vegetables, apple sauce, macaroni and peanut butter. Due to COVID-19, the number of hungry students has risen, causing the program's food costs to increase greatly. Financial donations may be made either through Fairmont's website or online at Ketteringbackpack.org.

#### Dayton Food Bank (South Dayton Foodbank/FISH)

The Dayton Food Bank has served as the primary source of food for the hunger relief network in the Miami Valley. This food bank-the only one of its kind in the area-relieves hunger in the community through a network of partner agencies by acquiring and distributing food. The food bank provides the infrastructure for more than 100 member food pantries, community kitchens and shelters that serve as the charitable hunger relief network in Montgomery, Greene, and Preble Counties, including the South Dayton Food Pantry/FISH, which serves Fairmont's immediate area. Donations to the Food Bank may be made either through Fairmont's website or online at the foodbank-dayton.org.
