Salvation is easy. In fact, it is free, at least for us. Discipleship is hard. It demands everything and then a bit more. I am saved by grace through faith. But my discipleship? Well, let's just charitably say that is a work in progress.

Once upon a time I knew a passionate and rather know-it-all young man in the church who left as a teenager because he started reading the New Testament. He could not reconcile the radical demands and claims of Jesus with the accommodating ministry of the congregation. He asked too many questions that people, especially youth group leaders, did not want to address. Curiosity led to judgment which led to estrangement. It is not an uncommon progression. Young people are acutely sensitive to hypocrisy in all its self-justified forms.

Nowhere is the distinction between what Jesus intends and what we have made sharper than in his Sermon on the Mount. It presents a radical break with all our assumptions of polite society and informs us that true discipleship will be far more costly than we thought. To follow Jesus as Messiah and Lord will simply require everything, and a bit more. It is no wonder than that the Sermon on the Mount is universally admired, but rarely considered a normative rule for living. Christian theologians have spent the past 15 centuries explaining that Jesus surely could not have meant what he said.

To paraphrase Mark Twain (a *Presbyterian!*), it is not the parts of the Bible that I do not understand that bother me. It is the parts that I do. And the Sermon on the Mount is straightforward and clear. Clever translations, contextual readings, and subtle hermeneutics will not get us off the hook. Jesus is ethically, morally, and spiritually demanding and to ignore those demands is to ignore him. We happily celebrate Jesus as savior who freely shares redemption with us, but Jesus as Lord who makes demands, not so much.

That young smart aleck grew up and somewhere along the way became middle-aged. Life has a way of teaching one nuance, complexity, and ambiguity. Time, circumstance, and the big muddies of moral ambiguities softened his judgments, but never resolved the inherent tension between God who loves us and saves us precisely as we are and God who so desperately wants us to become something more. So here I sit, every Lent, pulled between the poles of God's grace freely offered and the true cost of discipleship.

I believe with all my heart that I belong to Jesus. And I know with all my mind that I am not what Jesus hopes of me or for me. The tension between those certainties is the driving dynamic of my life and faith . . . and Lent.

Lent is the season of the church that confronts us with the hard examination of our lives in light of the cross. Lent does not provide us with simple answers. Lent instead mocks all our attempts at juvenile dualities and hollow judgments. Lent improves the quality of our questions and in doing so the quality of our lives.

I have no simple answer for the challenge of Lent. All I can offer is my companionship as we stumble forwards, humbled cowards, hypocrites, and the redeemed all, towards our journey's end and a new beginning.

Fairmont's mission activities focus primarily on local organizations that benefit at-risk families, children, and youth in our community and provide opportunities for hands-on mission work.

Artemis House

In January, Jane Keiffer, CEO of Artemis House, one of our supported organizations, shared an update with members during Church services. The mission of Artemis is "Working with the Community to Empower Survivors to Heal and Live Free of Domestic Violence". Artemis serves survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking. They collaborate with many community partners to increase safety for survivors and their children. Artemis offers a safe space where victims can feel seen, heard, believed, and empowered.

For 2021:

4,127 survivors were served6,665 hotline calls were completed661 child therapy sessions were held221 court accompaniments were made

Jane thanked Fairmont for our significant financial support over many years. We sent cards of encouragement and also filled and sent two large bins with personal items and household and cleaning supplies for their clients.

World Central Kitchen

In 2021, World Central Kitchen was added to the organizations we support, as we focus on those in need. WCK is on site serving chef-prepared meals to communities impacted by natural disasters and during prolonged humanitarian crises. They are a team of food first responders who mobilize with urgency to get meals to the people who need them most. As an example of the power of this organization, to date, WCK has distributed over a million meals to earthquake survivors in Syria and Turkey.
